SENATOR MATTHEWS' SPEECH.

Senator MATTHEWS, in the speech in which he opened the Ohio campaign for the Republicans, explained his views upon the silver question with great minuteness and clearness.

Mr. MATTHEWS favors the re-establishment of the bi-metallic standard, but with such qualifications and limitations as will keep the metallic silver in circulation together as a whole.

The re-remonetization of silver by a limited coinage, as proposed by Mr. MATTHEWS, would put our metallic currency on the same footing with that of the countries embraced within the principle of monetary union.

Will the public men and newspapers in both the North and the South who are now endeavoring to make the people in the two sections think that the principle of monetary union is a new thing, tell the people what issue there is now which should divide the country into sectional parties.

The Japan Mail claims that "Sionara," who has contributed several papers to the North American Review, is a veritable personage. It is not, but internal evidence of the papers contradicts any such theory.

Some of the Southern papers complain of the Government for not giving the section better postal facilities. It should be remembered that this cannot be done until Congress meets.

The IDEA prevails to some extent that the American race is deteriorating. Statistics show directly the contrary. For example, the result of careful investigations made in the United States in 1875 shows that the children of American parents are taller, heavier and healthier than the children of foreign parents at the same age.

The suggestion of making the District of Columbia a separate diocese of the Catholic Church seems to be favorably received by that denomination throughout the country.

It has been questioned as to whether the policy of making treaties with the Indians should not be abandoned. They are in every respect the subjects of the National Government.
