A REVIEW OF THE SITUATION. Two weeks more will have decided the question of standard-bearer of the republican party in the opening campaign. It is substantially settled now. Under all indications there is no look left upon which to hang a doubt as to whom will be awarded that important trust and responsibility.

THE CENTENNIAL STATE. The Grant men carried the primaries in Denver on Thursday by an overwhelming majority, and the county will send a solid delegation for the general to the state convention. As two-thirds of the delegates previously elected in the state are for Grant, the convention which meets on the 25th will be nearly unanimous for him.

There has been much in this preliminary canvass to bring regret to every sincere republican mind in the country. General Grant's name was presented early, and in response to what appeared to be the public wish, but it has in no degree been pressed upon the country through extraneous or illegitimate methods or agencies.
