FINANCIAL AND COMMERCIAL NEWS.

The following observations on the transactions in the financial market yesterday, together with opening and closing prices of the principal securities, are furnished by the banking-house of H. D. Cooke, Jr., & Co., 142 1/2 Street, Washington, D. C.

The stock market was dull and a repetition of yesterday's very dull, with slight fluctuations. The only particular feature has been a slight rally in State bonds, caused by the example of Tennessee, as set forth in the final passage of the State debt bill, which founds the State debt. This action was deemed as settling for a policy that might be followed by the other States South and elsewhere, and the reason being may be, it caused a fierce advance in Southern State bonds. The North Carolina special tax bonds advanced 1/2 per cent. advance to 107, while the sixes advanced to 25. Virginia closed strong at 122, and Tennessee sixes closed at 76.

Money continued in tight demand. The American District bank has been attracted attention from its wide fluctuations of late, opened at 55, closing at 56, the highest point reached during the day. Canal bonds, Hannibal and St. Jo preferred, Lake Shore, and Rock Island received decided advance over the opening prices, while the advance of the list has been well supported.
