MR. DORSEY'S SORE EYE.

They May Possibly Delay the Star-House Trials.

A REPUBLICAN reporter last evening called at the residence of ex-Senator Stephen W. Dorsey, on K street, to find out whether the state of his health would permit him to be present at the approaching star-route trial. The ex-Senator could not be seen, but Mrs. Dorsey received the reporter, and in answer to his inquiries she stated that since last July his eyes have been constantly troubling him, and that they are now in a very precarious condition. For some weeks past the ex-Senator has worn a bandage packed with cotton-wool over his eyes night and day. Lately it has been removed, but he has been compelled to wear a heavy shade and cannot see anything. He has been in constant attendance, told Mrs. Dorsey that unless her husband was very careful and followed his directions he would become totally blind. Excitement and anxiety over all the time, she has been the cause of the optic nerve becoming affected. Mrs. Dorsey further said that her husband has not been able to do any writing except sign his name for some time past, and that his signature is written "per se." The reporter next called on Mr. Richard T. Merrick to ascertain whether, on account of Mr. Dorsey's health, the government would consent to a continuance. "I shall resist my power any such force," was the answer. "But supposing a continuance should be granted, what then?" "When that condition of things arises I shall not be able to give an answer. I do not know if you think the defendants will ask for a continuance?" "There is no saying what the ingenuity of rogues may try to accomplish."

A Commission of Postmasters.

A commission composed of postmasters—E. S. Tully, Jr., of Boston; H. S. Hinderkopf, Philadelphia; S. A. Whitfield, Cincinnati; Samuel Hays, St. Louis; Frank Palmer, Chicago, and H. Adron, Baltimore, who are to be joined by a representative from the New York post-office—has assembled here to devise a plan to regulate the issue of stationery and other supplies to post-offices, with a view to securing uniformity. The commission will also try to arrange a plan for supplying these articles from the department, instead of allowing postmasters to contract separately for them. After a session of nearly three hours' duration, the commission adjourned sine die. A resolution was adopted, whereby the commission is authorized to make as possible a series of blanks, each postmaster to send a complete set of blanks to the other offices for selection and comparison, and the department to finally decide upon the styles best adapted to the service. A complete set of postal stationery was also agreed upon, which will be supplied to all offices directly by the department. Mr. Riblett represented the New York post-office at the conference.

The Independents Hold the Balance of Power—Kellogg's Case.

Anthropological Society.

The sixtieth regular meeting of the Anthropological Society was held last evening at the National Medical College. Dr. Robert Fletcher, U. S. A., in the chair. Two papers of very great interest were read. The first was by Mr. J. D. McGuire, of Elliott city, Md., on aboriginal soapstone quarries and the tools employed by the Indians in manufacturing vessels of this material. Mr. McGuire has in person examined several of the interesting sites, including the famous quarry here at Elliott city, and was able to exhibit the greatest interest in his description of the vessels and the tools employed in their manufacture. Interesting discussions were shared in by Dr. McGuire, and the other members of the society. The second paper was by Dr. Cyrus Thomas, archeologist of the bureau of ethnology, upon mound explorations in Union County, in Southern Illinois, near the Mississippi river, in the State of Kentucky. The speaker gave his experiences in mound-digging, and also his conclusions regarding the mound-builders. The meetings of this society are of the most interesting character, the papers ranging over the entire field of the natural history of man.

The Rothschild Revue Case.

United States Dist. Atty. S. M. Cutcheon, of Detroit, and Otto Kirchner, ex-Atty. Gen. of Michigan, have just commenced several days of legal business connected with the celebrated tobacco case against Rothschild of Detroit, in which it is claimed that the government has been systematically defrauded out of many thousand dollars. When the criminal case was tried there were charges made of jury bribery. The defendants have made extraordinary efforts to secure the acquittal, so far as to engage a woman to act as a witness, who, recently, as alleged, attempted to blackmail Solicitor Raynor. The Solicitor has ordered the case prosecuted with vigor, and Kirchner and Cutcheon, the latter for the attorney of the defendants, are now taking very important testimony to be presented to the court in Detroit. Dist. Atty. Cutcheon complains that witnesses are very hard to be secured in Washington.
