

## WORSE AND MORE OF IT.

### Pittsburg in Danger--The Greatest Flood Known for Fifty Years.

### Port Deposit, Md., Again Threatened by the Susquehanna Ice Gorge.

### The Greater Portion of the State of Ohio Along the Rivers Under Water.

### Great Distress Prevailing--Terrible Losses--What the Signal Office Says.

### Pittsburg, Pa., Feb. 7.--Indications point to another flood, this time from the Monongahela river. A heavy rain fell along the valley yesterday and last night, and dispatches from the headwaters this morning report the water rising rapidly. By to-morrow morning it is expected there will be a rise here of thirty feet.

Some of the trestles supporting the Smithfield street bridge have been washed away. The bridge is likely to go.

From present indications this section will be visited before morning with the greatest flood for fifty years. All day yesterday and last night rain fell in torrents at all points along the Monongahela valley, the record showing a total rain fall of 1 1/2 inches. This melted and carried off the snow on the mountains, and soon the creeks and streams were converted into small rivers, pouring their volumes of water into the Monongahela. Early this morning reports came from points above that the river was booming, but no rise occurred here until noon. The river then commenced swelling, and has since been rising rapidly. Dispatches from Morgantown, W. Va., Greensboro, and Brownsville, Pa., and other towns along the banks, state that the water is still rising at a rate of from 6 to 15 inches per hour. Many places are already partially submerged, and great destruction of property is anticipated. At this point there was 25 feet of water at 10 o'clock to-night, and from the amount yet to come it is thought that there will be from 32 to 35 feet before the flood ceases its highest stage. The damage done by the inundation and the possible washing away of the old Smithfield bridge, which is in a bad condition, no apprehension is felt here as to the result. The ice still in the Monongahela and the Youghiogheny rivers has been, it is thought, so rotted by the thaw of last week as to be in no condition to do damage. Portions of Allegheny City and south side are now under water, and by to-morrow morning it is expected the mills and factories along the rivers will be compelled to suspend operations.
