MRS. BETTS TRIUMPHS.

She is Appointed Administratrix of Her Husband's Estate.

Judge James made short work in the orphan's court yesterday of the contest for letters of administration on the estate of Col. William Betts by appointing the widow and requiring her to give a small bond. Early in the day Mr. William E. Shaffer, who had applied for letters, came in and asked for a continuance, stating that his attorney was absent from the city. Later Judge Polham, accompanied by Mrs. Betts, came in and in support of the latter's application filed two additional papers. One was the following petition, addressed to the presiding judge of the probate court:

"The undersigned most respectfully commend to your favorable consideration Mrs. Mary E. Betts, widow of the late Col. William H. Betts, formerly of Opelika. Mrs. Betts is a Christian woman of the highest respectability. She is the daughter of Dr. W. H. Griffin and has resided in this country all her life. She has always been a good woman, and a faithful and devoted wife."

This was signed by the judge of probate, clerk of the circuit court, sheriff of Lee county, register in chancery, postmaster of Opelika, and thirty-two others, citizens of the town of Opelika and Lee county.

The other was a deposition made by George G. Lanier, in which he stated that there never was any separation between Mr. and Mrs. Betts, and that no children of the two are now living.

When the case was called Mr. A. A. Birney said that he appeared for Judge Willoughby, the counsel for Mr. Shaffer, and had been informed that he did not desire to press the application, provided it could be shown that there had never been a separation between the parties during the lifetime of Col. Betts. Judge Polham appeared for Mrs. Betts, and related the circumstances of her husband's death, showing that she had always lived together as man and wife, and declared that she was the proper person to administer on the estate, which fact had been admitted by the other side.

Judge James was of the same opinion, and made the appointment, fixing the bond at \$2,000, which was given.

THE NEW SCHOOL HOUSES.

Work on One Already Begun and Plans Made for Two Others.

Work has been commenced on the excavation for the new school house to be erected on S street, between Thirteenth and Fourteenth streets northwest. When completed this building will accommodate 750 pupils and will consist of twelve large rooms. The rooms will be 27x36 and will be heated by steam, the building being too large to allow the Russian system to be used. The building will be of brick and stone and will be similar in style to the Annapolis school on G street, between Twenty-first and Twenty-second streets. The location of the new building is an excellent one, standing in the center of a large lot, which is in excellent sanitary condition. It is to cost \$44,000, and is to be completed by June 15, 1885.

The building department are also preparing plans for two new eight-room buildings. These buildings will be erected from the proceeds of the sale of the property held by the district known as the Holmead estate. This property is valued at nearly \$40,000, and it is thought two comfortable school buildings can be built from the proceeds. The commissioners recently purchased a lot in the eastern part of the city, where one of the two buildings will be erected. The sale of the Holmead property will take place shortly, and work will be begun as soon after as practicable.
