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HE THOUGHT SHE WAS RICH. And When He Discovered His Mistake Began to Treat Her Cruelly—A Divorce.

Sallie H. Hoover and Harry M. Golden were married in this city on the 10th of September last by the Rev. Charles M. Baldwin, and yesterday she petitioned for divorce and permission to resume her maiden name. It seems that the acquaintance between the couple prior to marriage was short, and he represented that she was a well-to-do doctor, and carried out his part so well as to deceive her into committing matrimony with him.

Mr. Kithburn is Free Again. Upon motion of the original court yesterday morning District Attorney Worthington asked permission, which was granted, to enter nolle pro in the case of Hallet Kithburn, indicted March 27, 1884, for relating to testify before an investigating committee of the House of Representatives into what was known as the real estate pool, and Mr. Kithburn being summoned to produce his books and papers, being finally was committed to jail, adjudged to be in contempt. He was subsequently released on habeas corpus, rearrested under the indictment, and admitted to bail. A few months ago he was arrested by the House committee, and sentenced to prison for \$100,000 damages.
