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DOSE WITHOUT A PERMIT.

Mr. Hannan Opens a Street to Clean a Sewer.

Yesterday morning Mr. Daniel Hannan applied at the District building for a permit to clean out the sewer at the southwest corner of New Jersey avenue and H street northwest.

Mr. Hannan's application was granted, but the officials accepted the \$1 fee, but refused to accept the application on the old and legal form, offering in its place a new form prepared for the use of the unregulated plumbers.

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ABOLISH INTERNAL REVENUE

The Virginia Legislature Clearly Not in Accord With the President.

RICHMOND, Va., Dec. 8.--In the house of delegates to-day a joint resolution was adopted by a vote of 90 to 1 directing Virginia senators and requesting their representatives in Congress to use their best efforts to secure the repeal at an early day of the entire internal revenue system of taxation, and, failing that, to secure, if possible, the repeal of so much of the system as imposes a tax on tobacco in any form, and upon spirits distilled from fruits.

A resolution was adopted tendering the use of the hall of the house of delegates to-morrow to Hon. Sir John Hanblston, Halling Street, and William Handolph, members of the British parliament, for the purpose of holding a conference on the subject of international affairs.
