

DISSATISFIED LANDLORDS.

THEY PROTEST AGAINST THE FINDING OF THE COMMISSION.

A Committee Waits on Lord Salisbury to Urge Their Claims of Losses by the Recent Legislation--The Commission Denounces.

LONDON, Feb. 3.—A deputation of Irish landlords waited upon Lord Salisbury today to urge their claims for loss through recent legislation, and took occasion to denounce the findings of the land commission which still further reduced their income from the land.

Lord Salisbury congratulated them upon their awakening to the importance of a unanimous and energetic policy of self-defense, and reminded them that if landlords had shown similar energy some years ago they would have been spared much of their present misery.

As it was, he deeply sympathized with them, and promised to consider their proposals for remedial legislation.
