LAKE CHARLES.

Lake Charles, the seat of justice of

Calcasieu parish, is situated on the

eastern shore of a lake called also Lake

Charles, 35 miles east of Orange, Texas,

60 miles north of the Gulf of Mexico,

and 216 miles from New Orleans, by

the line of the railroad from New Or-

leans to Houston, Texas, via Morgan

City, New Iberia, Vermilionville and

Lake Charles, La., and Orange, Texas.

The Calcasieu river flows through

the western edge of the above named

lake, and the railroad runs, on trestle

work, through its northern edge. The

lake is nearly two miles broad oppo-

site the town, and is two miles wide

north and south, being almost circular

in form. Steamboats and schooners, from

the Calcasieu river and Mexican gulf

trade, cross the lake in all directions,

and land at our saw mills and wharves.

The population of Lake Charles is

about 800, and is rapidly increasing.

This does not include settlements near

town. We have here the court-house,

telegraph office, railroad depot, one

newspaper, three churches, catholic,

methodist and German methodist, one

steam rice mill, nine steam saw mills,

ten stores, two drug stores, three ho-

tels, two restaurants, three meat mar-

kets, eleven saloons, three blacksmith

shops, two saddl
