Rules for the 14th Judicial Dis-

trict Court.

RULE I.
The regular hour for opening of Court shall be 10 o'clock A. M., from October 1st to March 31st, and 9 A. M., from April 1st to September 30th. Court shall not apply to instances where the hour for opening is otherwise specially fixed in the order for adjournment.

RULE II.
The Court House bell shall be rung twice by the sheriff, the first time, twenty minutes, and the second, five minutes, before the opening of Court. The same shall be done before resuming business after a recess of more than one hour.

RULE III.
All cases at issue on the first day of the term shall stand fixed for trial on the second and each succeeding day of the term, and shall be disposed of as fast as reached, in the order in which they stand upon the docket.

RULE IV.
All cases put at issue after the opening of Court shall be fixed, and called for trial in the order in which they stand on the docket, according to Rule III. provided, that no such case shall be taken up for trial, except by consent, until at least two days after it is put at issue.

RULE V.
Any case may be fixed by consent, provided, the trial thereof shall not be allowed to interfere with the trial of any other case, fixed under Rules III and IV.

RULE VI.
Immediately after the reading of the minutes, the names of the attorneys present will be called, at which time all preliminary motions and exceptions must be filed, and preliminary judgments by default entered. Immediately afterwards judgments by default may be confirmed, and judgments may be taken by confession.

RULE VII.
All preliminary motions and exceptions shall be tried immediately after the business provided by Rule VI shall have been disposed of, provided, that not more than one hour shall be consumed by their trial each day. All such motions and exceptions shall be disposed of, according to the date of their filing, on the day after their filing, or as soon thereafter as they can be reached, provided, it shall be in order for the court to call up, hear and try any motions, exceptions, judgments by default or confession, at any interval of court, during term time, not otherwise occupied, and such motions or exceptions shall have become mature for hearing, in conformity with this rule.

RULE VIII.
In all arguments, in civil cases, counsel shall be allowed the following time, viz: On trials of motions, exceptions, etc., fifteen minutes for the opening, twenty minutes for each counsel answering, and fifteen minutes for the closing. On the merits of any civil case, one hour shall be allowed for each argument. Arguments, provided for by Art. 285, C. P., on new points or new authorities, shall be limited to ten minutes.

RULE IX.
No record shall be withdrawn except by a practicing attorney at law, or the Judge, who shall sign a receipt therefor, describing particularly each and every document so withdrawn, and shall retain the same not more than five days, except during term time, when such record must be withheld not more than one day. And the cancelling of the receipt, shall constitute a certificate that such document so withdrawn has been returned.

RULE X.
All instructions to the Clerk or Sheriff, and agreements of counsel, upon which the Court is to act, must be in writing, and, if requested, produced in open Court.

RULE XI.
Sheriffs and their deputies, in all cases, must make personal service of subpoenas for witnesses, if that is impossible, the return thereon must show what efforts were made to make such service, and why the same was not made. Whenever so required, in writing, by the Sheriff, party, or their counsel, ordering the residence of witnesses, or the place where they may be found; provided, the inability of parties or counsel to furnish the information herein required, will in no way excuse the sheriff from exercising the greatest legal diligence to secure the attendance of all witnesses ordered. Counsel shall furnish the Sheriff with a list of witnesses they desire called in any case. All orders for witnesses must be in writing, and entered on the Clerk's order book, or attached thereto.

RULE XII.
All pleadings shall be written on not less than a half sheet of legal or foolscap paper, and shall be endorsed by the counsel filing the same, with the title of the suit and the character of the document.

RULE XIII.
There shall be no preference cases, except jury cases, and such other cases as are accorded a preference by law.
