Proceedings of the Police Jury.—Parish of Lafourche.

On this 23d day of September 1865, the Police Jury of the Parish of Lafourche met.
 Were present:—Judge J. J. Roman, Arsene Bergeron, Sothens Folse, Joseph Remont, Frank Dalferes, J. S. Perkins, P. J. Theriot, John Nelson, Washington Griffin.
 Absent:—David B. Pugh, John Lyall.
 The present members were sworn as Police Jurors of the Parish of Lafourche by Theophile Harang, Justice of the Peace, and took their seats as such.
 Mr. J. S. Perkins was proposed and nominated as President pro tem, and took the chair.

Then the Police Jury proceeded to the election of the following officers:
 Mr. Perkins was proposed for the office of President of the Police Jury, and unanimously elected.

Emile E. Leblanc was proposed for the office of Clerk of the Police Jury, and unanimously elected.

MM. P. E. Lorio & F. Sanoan, Editors of the Thibodaux Sentinel, were proposed as Parish Printers, unanimously elected.
 Mr. Taylor Beattie was proposed for the office of Parish Attorney, and unanimously elected.

On motion duly seconded, it was ordered that a committee of two members be appointed by the President (himself to be added thereto) for the purpose of waiting upon the military authority having command and charge of the Parish jail, in and for the Parish of Lafourche, with a view of seeking and procuring if practicable, the joint possession and use of said jail, on such terms and conditions as may be mutually and amicably agreed upon; said Committee to make and return a report of their doings and proceedings to the next meeting of this body for ultimate and final action thereon.
 The President appointed on the above Committee, Judge Roman and Major Nelson.

On motion duly seconded, Judge Roman, J. Remont and F. Dalferes were appointed by the President, on a committee to examine the Parish Road and Levee Laws, for the purpose of suggesting what changes, if any, are necessary to be made thereto; and to make their report at the next meeting of this body.

On motion: this meeting was adjourned to the 28th. instant, at 10 o'clock A. M.

One bond for the sum of Five Hundred dollars, with Jos. Dantin and Arsene Bergeron, as securities.

On motion of Mr. H. Hoffman, it was Resolved, That the regular meetings of this body be held on the first Monday of every month, at early candle light.

On motion, the meeting adjourned sine die.
