ORDINANCE No. 4. RELATIVE TO OBSTRUCTIONS IN THE BAYOU. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Trustees of the town of Thibodaux, That no Oysterman or other person shall throw oysters or shells or any other obstructions in the Bayou Lafourche, within the Corporate limits under the penalty of not less than five nor more than twenty-five dollars, and costs, to be recoverable before any Justice of the Peace.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, &c. That such disposition shall be the care of bad oysters and shells, as the Constable shall direct from time to time. (Signed) S. T. GRISAMORE, Mayor. P. E. LORIO, Secretary. ORDINANCE No. 5.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Trustees of the town of Thibodaux, That an ad valorem tax of one per cent be levied on all real and personal property within the Corporate limits of Thibodaux, according to the Table of 1865, one fourth of which will go to the Corporation fund, and three-fourth to the School fund. S. T. GRISAMORE, Mayor. P. E. LORIO, Secretary. ORDINANCE No. 6.

RELATIVE TO THE WHARFINGER AND COLLECTOR. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Trustees of the town of Thibodaux, That the office of Wharfinger and Collector shall be conferred on one and the same person, until otherwise provided, and that within ten days after having been duly and regularly qualified, the Mayor and Trustees shall proceed to elect, by ballot, a competent person to fill said station for and during the space of one year.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, &c. That before entering on the discharge of his duties, the said officer shall execute and make in favor of the Mayor and Trustees, and their successors in office, his bond, in solidum, in the sum of three hundred dollars, (\$300), with two good and solvent sureties, residing in the parish, to the satisfaction of the Mayor, conditioned that he will faithfully discharge and perform all the duties incumbent on him, and pay over all sums of money he may receive in said capacity, pursuant to the ordinances of the town, and besides take and subscribe, before the Clerk of the Corporation an oath of the same purport.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, &c. That it shall be and hereby is made the duty of the Wharfinger and Collector to collect faithfully, all the dues and taxes coming to the town, arising from the wharffages, exhibitions, or any other source of revenue, and to keep a detailed account of all monies received by him for the Corporation, designating clearly the sources whence they are derived, and pay the same over to the town Treasurer on his receipts, specifying the sum received under each different head.

Sec. 4. Be it further ordained, &c. That it shall be the duty of said officer, monthly to make out and submit to the Council, a detailed statement of the amounts collected by him for the last month, and submit therewith the receipt of the Treasurer in due form therefor; and annually, on the first Monday in May, he shall submit to said Board a full recapitulation of the amounts by him received and paid over during the course of the year.

Sec. 5. Be it further ordained, &c. That the said officer shall, on the receipt of the warrant for the collection of the corporation taxes, proceed immediately to notify the persons assessed, pursuant to the ordinance entitled "An ordinance relative to the revenue of the town," approved 10th July, 1847; and after the expiration of the delay therein mentioned, proceed forthwith to the collection thereof, and pay over the same in full on or before the first day of March of each year.

Sec. 6. Be it further ordained, &c. That the said officer shall be entitled to any commission on the amount of the assessment roll, until he shall have settled and paid up in full the whole amount thereof, and have obtained the Treasurer's receipt; that the calculation of the amount of such commission shall be made by the Treasurer, on the amount really paid over, not including deductions made, and the said Collector shall execute his receipt therefor to the said Treasurer.

Sec. 7. Be it further ordained, &c. That should said Collector or Wharfinger fail to pay over in full the amounts which he shall owe in his said capacity he shall lose his commission on the whole, and in an action against him and sureties, for the deficit, they will not be entitled to claim said commission. Sec. 8. Be it further ordained, &c. That no persons shall hereafter be re-elected Collector and Wharfinger until he shall have obtained a full discharge and hold his quibus from the Treasurer.

Sec. 9. Be it further ordained, &c. That full and final rendition of all taxes due on the assessment roll shall be made by said officer, on or before the first day of March of each year. Sec. 10. Be it further ordained, &c. That the said officer shall execute and put in force all laws, ordinances, &c. of the town of Thibodaux which may be specially referred to his province. Sec. 11. Be it further ordained, &c. That on the sums received and paid over by the said officer, pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance, he shall be entitled to receive, in full compensation, five per cent on ordinary and ten per cent on special taxes.

Sec. 12. Be it further ordained, &c. That all laws, ordinances and resolutions, to these contrary, be, and the same hereby are, repealed and abrogated. (Signed) S. T. GRISAMORE, Mayor. P. E. LORIO, Secretary.

STATE OF LOUISIANA, PARISH OF LAFOURCHE. POLICE JURY.

Pursuant to adjournment the Police Jury of the Parish of Lafourche met this 24th October, 1865. Present:—J. S. Perkins, President, J. J. Loman, D. B. Pugh, Arsene Bergeron, Sosthene Folse, J. Remont, John Lyall, John Nelson, Washington Griffin. Absent:—P. J. Theriot, F. Dalferes. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. On motion, Jury adjourned till 3 o'clock, P. M.

At 3 o'clock, P. M. Jury met. Present:—The same members as this morning. On motion duly seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

Whereas from petitions numerously and respectfully signed it is made to appear, That the levees on the lands of Joseph Knight and Octave Polse, in said Parish of Lafourche, and on the right bank of the Bayou, were cut from military authority and by military authority, it was ordered That a committee composed of Messrs. Joseph Remont, Joseph Knight and Napoleon Bourgeois, be and is hereby appointed, instructed and directed to wait upon Gen. Canby to lay before him the nature and evidence of the case and respectfully request him to have and cause said breaches to be substantially and thoroughly closed up and repaired at Government expenses and in the most speedy and efficient manner practicable.

On motion duly seconded, the following resolution was adopted. Whereas the Treasury is at present empty and whereas the detailed estimate of the probable expenditures for the current year average (\$825,000) five thousand eight hundred and twenty-five dollars:

Now therefore to meet, cover and defray said expenses and charges both ordinary and extraordinary, on motion duly seconded, it was hereby resolved, 1st. That the parish licenses for the present year on all taxable professions, trades, occupations and employments as fixed, determined and taxed by the State tax law of 1865, be and the same are hereby set and assessed at the rate of one fourth of said State license and that the same be levied and collected the present year by the Sheriff of the parish of Lafourche ex-officio state and parish tax collector.

2d. That one fourth of the parish taxes assessed and uncollected of the year 1861, be and the same are hereby ordered and directed to be likewise levied and collected the present year, by the Sheriff of said ex-officio state and parish tax collector. On motion duly seconded, it was ordered that the estimate of the probable expenses of the parish for the current year 1865, be published according to law.

On motion duly seconded, it was ordered That the committee of finance be requested by the President to examine the accounts of Alexander Ribbeck, parish treasurer and report thereon at the next meeting of this body. On motion, Jury adjourned sine die. (Signed) J. S. PERKINS, President. E. E. LEBLANC, Secretary.
