### DEATH ENDS GAREER OF REP. J. R. MANN LONG HOUSE LEADER

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Dec. 1.—Death last a giant of the house.

Returning here two weeks ago for the opening of the special session of Congress, Mr. Mann who has served his people for upwards of a quarter of a century took part in the prelimianry work of the house. A week ago, however, he was forced to stay at home because of a cold, which he failed to shake off. His condition at first was not regarded as serious and it was came alarming. Early in the evening, he rallied but there was a change for the worse as the night wore on.

That it would have required a powerful effort to beat him if he had gone out for either of these places was the opinion freely held in the house.

It was understood that services would be held at the late representa-tive's home in Chicago and that Mr. Mann would be buried beside his son there who died four years ago.


