


CAMERA SNAPS ROUMANIA'S CONQUEROR IN DOBRUDJA REGION

Reports from all these states will be embodied in the annual address of Miss Anna A. Gordon, President of the National W. C. T. U. at the convention of the organization here Nov. 17-22.

Tomorrow at Evanston, Ill., headquarters of the National W. C. T. U. a big silk flag will be spread between the elms in front of the old Francis E. Willard home, which is the office building of the organization she headed, to celebrate the victories, for the prohibitionists declare it is a victory whether they have the largest number of votes cast or not. They base their claim on the statement that the campaign goes a long way to educate the people in their doctrines.

The state conducting offensive campaigns against the saloon are Michigan, South Dakota, Nebraska, Montana, California, Idaho and the Territory of Alaska. The state conducting defensive campaigns are Oregon,

Washington, Colorado, Arkansas, Mississippi and Arizona. In South Dakota both suffrage and prohibition are at issue, and at W. C. T. U. headquarters they call it "a double header election," because the National W. C. T. U. is one of the pioneers of the suffrage cause, and the organization is as deeply interested in suffrage as in the temperance cause.

LADIES' REDINGOTE.

At the very pinnacle of fashion is the redingote of this season, and you are sure to like the model in the illustration—its lines strike the keynote of fall smartness.

The body part, with its seamed front and smart fitted effect, has the vest idea carried out—just a two button closing makes it distinctive. The collar, of course, plays an important role, for collars have been on the style creators' minds for months. Black satin contributes the collar on this garment and the cuffs on "near-fit" long sleeves are in harmony. The shorter sleeve is also allowed, with a roll cuff.

The skirt is in three gores, with its upper edges gathered and joined to the waist, the front edges being even with the side front seams of the waist and the ripple fullness falls prettily to about ankle length. There is a great variety of fabrics from which this type of garment may be made. If you use a wool material be sure to have it sponged to avoid spotting or shrinking. Wool or silk embroidery may be employed to further embellish the model, and of course on broadcloth or velour fur will be ultra smart.
