DEMPSEY CHANGES FRONT (INTERNATIONAL NEWS SERVICE) SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 5.—Mrs. Maxine Dempsey, divorced wife of Jack Dempsey, heavyweight champion, in a sworn statement before a notary public repudiated former statements alleged to have been made by her that Dempsey was a slacker and that he purposely evaded the draft law, claiming that she was dependent on him.

Mrs. Dempsey appeared before Col. Thomas, who is conducting the investigation for the department of justice in the Dempsey slacker charges, and presented him the affidavit sworn to before the notary public. GEORGES TO WED "A YOUNG GIRL"


