

MILITANT SUFFRAGISTS ON GRIDDLE

Alice Paul and Cohorts Will Be In Marion July 22 to Heckle Harding

MARION, O., July 16.—Ohio women are organizing a "Harding for President Club" to offset the effect of a recent statement issued by the militant suffrage organization at Washington, D. C., attacking Senator Harding, the Republican nominee, for alleged lukewarmness in support of suffrage.

The militants will be in Marion July 22 for the Harding notification ceremonies. Alice Paul, their leader, has secured from Senator Harding an agreement to grant her a conference early in the day at which she will present a demand that Harding insist on action by Vermont or Connecticut, on the suffrage amendment before the November elections. Senator Harding will discuss the suffrage amendment in his acceptance speech.

WOMEN BACK HARDING.

In the meantime Ohio women are backing up Senator Harding, who stated recently that the Republican party is responsible for the submission of the amendment, and no matter which may be the state to finish the ratification, actual accomplishment of suffrage should go to the credit of the Republican party. Mrs. C. C. Pavey of Columbus, O., is president of the Ohio organization. Women interested in the cause of suffrage and in the success of the Republican ticket are asked to attend a preliminary meeting of the club at Columbus today.

OFFER THEIR SERVICES.

The club has for its object the triumph of the country Republican principles, believing the welfare of the country will be best served by the election of Harding and Coolidge," says Mrs. Pavey. "They represent all that is best in true Americanism, and in their election we predict a solution of the many problems now confronting the country. We are going in full strength to Marion on notification day to offer our services to Senator Harding regarding whether we vote or do not vote. We have brothers, fathers, husbands and others who will vote and vote for Harding and Coolidge are what we are striving for."

Senator Harding issued a statement yesterday to the effect that the organization of a third party and the placing of a third national ticket in the field will not change the campaign plans of the Republicans. He said that the Republican party has offered to the judgement of the voters a sound and progressive platform which he believed would commend itself to all classes.
