

# Wants U.S. To Think In Millions

## Harding Deplores High Finance Which Runs Into Billions Instead.

MARION, O., Aug. 25.—On the issue of economy in government alone the republicans deserve to be entrusted with the affairs of the nation for the next four years, it was declared here this afternoon by Senator Warren G. Harding. He spoke to a delegation of Wyandotte county republicans who met here to Marion for a neighborly front porch address.

In a speech devoted largely to a review of republican economics since the party's return to power in 1918, Senator Harding pledged anew that if he is elected this year "administrative waste" will be stopped and the affairs of government conducted on a business like basis.

"I want to acclaim the day," said the senator, "when we may think in millions once more."

He deplored the high finance which has run government costs into terms of millions.

Senator Harding also took a subtle dig at the league of nations.

"The European states," he said, "have made their covenants, but we continue. We have entered into no covenant, and we have actual peace."

To the large number of women in the delegation, the candidate said:

"It is significant that the women are here as a part of your numbers. It is likewise becoming clothed as they are soon to be with the right of suffrage. It is a fine example of the appreciation of the responsibility of this added duty of citizenship that they observe their first opportunity to show their interest in matters political."

"Whatever matters political there may have been in the granting of the right of suffrage to women, there can be no question as to their fitness, their capacity, their patriotism and their earnestness. Whenever American women determine upon a course they have universally made a complete success. They will regard their obligation with seriousness and always with a concern for their country's welfare."

"Our country is suffering today in common with much of the world as a result following the war. We have this difference to distinguish us from Europe:

"We have actual peace, though not formally declared, while much of Europe is engaged in war. The government at Washington is still functioning very large under special war-time legislation. The continuance of these

"We need to reduce our cost of gov-

ernment as one means towards reducing the cost of living. Realizing this, the republican congress during a year of its existence, cut great expenditures two and three-fourth billions of dollars from the departmental estimates prepared by the demonstrative administration.

"When the republican congress elected in 1918 came into control it did so under a pledge to reduce the cost of government and stop extravagance and waste. That pledge has been splendidly kept."

Senator Harding charged that democrats in congress had attempted to discredit the republicans, but that this had been frustrated and supply bills passed at a saving of a billion dollars. No "pork barrel" appropriations were made under republican supervision, he declared.

Blame for the present high cost of government, he laid at democratic doors in not making adequate preparations to bear the cost of war.




