## RUSH FOR SEATS AT MORAN GO

East Chicago is all set today for the first real championship boxing contest which has been held in the city and the management of the arena have made all arrangements to take care of the large crowd which began to arrive early this morning. The box office opened at nine o'clock and there were a number who were waiting before the window to get the first chances at the bleacher seats. Hot dog and beer stands were ready to do business and prepared to serve luncheon to those who came before noon.

This is what might be considered East Chicago's first championship bout. There have already been two champions perform in the arena but in both cases their opponents were not logical contenders for the championship while in today's fight there seems to be a fair chance that Moran may score a knock-out and thus win the lightweight crown.

Frankie Mason, the flyweight champion and Pete Herman, the bantamweight champion are the other two title holders who have fought at East Chicago.
