"That story is the bunk," said Jess, commenting on a report issued by a Lawrence store keeper that he had been signed. "I've been doing a little exercising down here on my farm, and my old gloves were worn out. I needed a new pair and went down to a sporting goods store. You know how these fellows like to get their name into the paper so they made a story of that."

"Are you seriously considering any offer to re-enter the ring?" he was asked.

"No, no, no," said Jess with heat. "Nothing doing. I'm satisfied down here on the farm."
