MORE THINKING ABOUT CHRIST, BISHOP'S PLEA

Annual Conference of Methodists at Lebanon, Northwest Indiana Event

LEBANON, Ind., Sept. 30.—Opening the annual session of the Northwest Indiana Conference of the Methodist Episcopal church here yesterday, Dr. F. D. Leste, bishop of the newly created Indiana area, made an address in which he insisted that the ministry put first things first. He said that preachers should do more thinking about Christ and His mission than about what the preachers or other men may think about Christ.

The bishop deplored the fact that there is, in his opinion, entirely too much preaching now about theology and doctrine and too little thinking and preaching about Christ. He said that there is a tendency on the part of Methodist pastors to stress the importance of the appointments to which they are assigned rather than the job that confronts them.

Sessions of the conference are being held in the Centenary Methodist Episcopal church. The meeting will close next Monday with the announcement of pastoral assignments for the coming year by the bishop and the conference cabinet.

Preliminary Meeting.
A preliminary meeting of the conference was held last night when the Rev. M. H. Appleby, of First church, Crawfordsville, preached on "The All Sufficient Motive." The board of examiners and the cabinet held a session last night, at which time it was learned that the list of applicants for admission to the ministry is the largest presented in many years. Among those who have taken the examination are Henry F. Braun, Frank S. Dawson, C. N. McBray, J. A. Lord, Harold F. Pearson and Robert Ross Shannon.

The bishop and the cabinet held their first formal session this afternoon at the home of Samuel S. Heath, which is the bishop's home while attending the conference.
