When the resolution was up to bat liquor from men in the military service Watson and Harding both voted against an amendment offered by McKellar regarding use of liquor at military establishments. Underwood then proposed to include members of congress within the provisions of the military law and Watson favored a motion to table it.

Watson found it convenient to be absent when the senate balloted on an amendment by Wadsworth substituting the "spirituous" for "intoxicating" in the war prohibition bill, nor was he present when the amendment by Reed preventing the sale of intoxicating liquors during the war, was voted on.

An amendment by Wadsworth permitting the manufacture of rum used in the preparation of tobacco found support in the votes of both Watson and Harding.

When a bill came up prohibiting the use of agricultural products in the manufacture, sale or gift of liquors for beverage purposes, Harding voted against it and Watson was recorded as not voting.

Both Watson and Harding voted "nay" to Sheppard's amendment to have the Reed bone dry law apply to the District of Columbia, and they both again registered opposition to an amendment prohibiting the importation of distilled liquors during the war period.

WILL BUILD HOME TO HOUSE TEACHERS

INDIANAPOLIS, IND., Oct. 12.—So serious is the housing problem for school teachers in the Windsor consolidated school district of Weld county that the school board will erect a "teachorage" for the accommodation of nearly two score tutors in the district.

The building will be like a large home in general appearance, but will be modeled in the matter of accommodations like an apartment house—modified slightly to the form of a sorority house. It will be for women teachers only.

The building will be of modern construction to cost \$30,000. In addition to bedrooms, baths, etc., it will contain a large living room, a study equipped with a library, and a laundry in the basement.

Man Who Lost \$200 Has Gone into Court to Recover

INDIANAPOLIS, IND., Oct. 12.—The stolen \$200 cash bond which has been troubling official East Chicago for the past three years again hopped yesterday when City Attorney Critch notified the board of works that the city was about to be sued for the \$200. The money was given as cash bond after a man had been arrested as a deserter in December of 1917. He was later released and sent to camp but has never been able to get his money back although he has made repeated demands.

The city council not long ago appropriated \$200 to reimburse the man but the state board of accounts refused to allow payment and now an effort will be made to secure the money by suit. It is probable that the city will not attempt to defend the suit in order that the man may a once get the money which rightfully belongs to him.

The board of works instructed the water company to place a fire plug on Euclid avenue between 114th and 145th streets for adequate protection of the General American property, the South Shore company reported they were unable at this time to pave their right of way on Euclid avenue and the fire.
