BRITISH MINERS STRIKE VOTE IS GETTING STRONGER
LONDON, Oct. 13.—Incomplete returns from the coal fields today strengthened the belief that the miners' referendum vote will be strongly against the recent tentative agreement of the Federation of Miners and the Colliery Owners and in favor of a general strike. The Welsh miners voted ten to one against the agreement, and, according to early returns from other parts of the United Kingdom, the vote will be about five to one against the agreement.

DENVER, COLO., Oct.—St. Patrick's School is at work in Colorado. When a plea reached State Labor Commissioner W. L. Morrissey from residents of Yuma County begging for aid in ridding the schoolhouse in that district of snakes, he turned the task over to J. H. Mitchell, state factory inspector.
