

MARINES KILLED 3,250 BANDITS IN REFORMING HAYTI

(INTERNATIONAL NEWS SERVICE)
WASHINGTON, Oct. 13.—A summary of the report on conditions in Hayti from July, 1918, when American marines entered Hayti, until June 30, 1920, made by Brig. Gen. Barnett former commandant of the marine corps was made public by the navy department today.

The report shows that during that period 5,250 Haytian bandits were killed by marines and the gendarmerie.

It is not possible to say how many were wounded. One marine officer was killed and two wounded and twelve enlisted men were killed and 26 wounded. Two officers and 24 enlisted men died from other causes.

Gen. Barnett stated that while the death of bandits seem large, the operations covered a period of five and a half years, and it was his opinion that without the presence of the marines a greater number of Haytian citizens would have been killed by bandits.
