

TWO INSTEAD OF TEN HANG IN CHICAGO

(INTERNATIONAL NEWS SERVICE) CHICAGO, Oct. 14.—Nooks of eight men who were to hang wriggled out of the noose and instead of ten but two men went to the scaffold in the grim, gray yard of the county jail this morning.

Of three men who were to be hanged tomorrow two have won reprieve and only one will expiate his crime. In all ten of the thirteen men who a week ago were waiting to pay a forfeit of a "life for a life" that judges and juries had imposed upon them have been given another chance. One has won commutation of sentence to life imprisonment; several have been granted

the boon of a new trial, and for others the evidence that first found them guilty will be reviewed. All but one, however, still lurk in the shadow of the gallows. But for Frank Campione, a 22 year old "gangster" and for John Henry Reese, whose skin is black, there came no reprieve and early today they walked to the scaffold and paid the penalty for murder. Throughout the death-watch both Campione and Reese clung to the hope of a reprieve but none came. Dramatic scenes in the grim old jail attended the last hours of Campione and Reese. Nicholas Viana, Campione's companion, was to have gone to his death today. In the death cell he sang, in a clear tenor voice, his good-bye to the world. "Misere," he chanted and the "Tower song," from "Il Trovatore." But for the quick of fate that made him a slayer Viana might have been an opera star.

As he sang the other prisoners huddled in their cells in awesome silence. And while he sang the reprieve came that granted him a stay of sentence to November 12. Campione, a member of the famous Cardinella gang of "gunmen" against which six murderers have been charged, was hanged for the slaying of Andrew P. Bowman, owner of a saloon. Reese paid the penalty for slaying his wife in a fit of jealousy. Reese was the first to go to the scaffold, Campione following.

SIDEWALL OF TIRES NOT MERELY A BILLBOARD

The side-wall of an automobile casing is not simply an advertising billboard for the manufacturer, nor is its main use to specify size and type of tire. Though it carries practically all the markings on the casing, it has a much more important mission in life. Like the skin on the body, its duty is to protect the carcass underneath. As some skins are red, some white and some yellow, so are some sidewalls red, some white and some tan. Some are gaudy, others conservative. Some are black and blue and striped.

While the side wall is a thing of beauty, it is primarily compounded for endurance and resiliency. At the edge of the rim, it forms a seal against water seepage. It prevents chafing between the rim and the inner fabric, and serves as a bulwark between rim and tread line against rays of the sun, grinding of the road, and the moisture which causes rotting. Its enemies are oil, grease, ruts and curbs. According to the Miller school of tire repairing, it has an important part in giving the tire grace and elegance of appearance, which, combined with uniformity and maximum mileage, gives a perfect tire.

At the upper edges, it serves as an anchor for securely fastening the edges of the tread. Altogether it is only a fraction of an inch in thickness.

MINER'S STRIKE IN BRITAIN APPEARS INEVITABLE NOW
LONDON, Oct. 14.—A general strike throughout the British coal fields appeared inevitable today. A. B. Platt, one of the delegates of the South Wales coal miners declared this afternoon that a strike was certain. Work may stop in the coal fields next Saturday, unless government intervention succeeds in staying the strike. The men are demanding a wage increase of two shillings per shift and a reduction in the price of coal to the domestic consumer. If the strike begins the Federation of Miners expects to have the support of the railway men and the dock workers.
