WASHINGTON, Nov. 12.—Everything had seemed to "normalize" at SHAWNEE, O., today, the convention having adjourned.

President-elect Warren G. Harding, who got up at 2:30 a. m., had breakfast of walnuts, clipped beef, coffee, fresh strawberries and grapes, and then plunged into work.

Senator Harding will not give serious attention to selection of his cabinet until after he returns from a month's vacation into Texas and the English canal zone, but it was generally expected that John W. Weeks, Massachusetts senator, would be secretary of the navy and George Satterlee, former Utah senator, who has been chosen adviser of senator Harding during the past three months, would be attorney-general. All other selections were pure "dope" one of the speculations on the cabinet gossip.

Secretary of commerce—John J. Coughlin of Wisconsin.  
Secretary of the treasury—Frank B. Rowden of Illinois or Fred W. Ephraim, Wisconsin national treasurer.  
Secretary of agriculture—Henry Wallace of Iowa, editor of a farm paper, or Senator Arthur Capper of Kansas.  
Secretary of war—George W. Wick, former attorney general, John B. McInerney or Major General Leonard




