Gipp Fractures Collar Bone in Hoosier Fray

NOTRE DAME, Ind., Nov. 16.—Battered and bruised from the struggle with Indiana, Notre Dame athletes opened training for the Northwestern game with a light workout in the gymnasium yesterday afternoon. Carter Field was covered with a blanket of snow. Unless Coach Hoke's prediction goes askew, Notre Dame will face the Purple without the services of George Gipp, star halfback, and H. Anderson, guard. Both men were badly injured in the fray at Indianapolis. Gipp suffered a fractured collar bone early in the first quarter, but he performed through the contest solely on his grit. Although suffering excruciating pain, Gipp refused to leave the game until he had started his team toward victory by scoring a touchdown on the second play of the last quarter.



Fokker, the inventor of the Fokker monoplane, used by the Germans during the war and declared by allied experts to be the fastest pursuit planes in the war, has arrived in the United States with Mrs. Fokker. Fokker, who says that he retained his Dutch citizenship all through the war, states that he offered England and America his plane as far back as 1912, but they did not take him seriously, so he found another market—Germany.
