TERRE HAUTE, Ind., Dec. 17.—Alex Howat of Kansas is leading Philip Murray by a big majority in the race for vice presidency of the United Mine Workers, according to unofficial returns from the eleventh union district today. The contest between John L. Lewis and Robert Harlan for the presidency is so close no estimate can be made on their standing, it was stated. Interest in the close district race overshadows the international contest. The first five locals reporting gave Lewis, 340; Harlan, 302; Howat, 321; Murray, 215.

FARMERS GATHER IN ST. LOUIS

ST. LOUIS, Mo., Dec. 17.—Representatives of farmers organizations all over the nation, meeting here under auspices of the National board of farm organizations, to seek remedies for the critical situation and to confront agriculturalists because of credit conditions and lowering prices for their products, had before them today a plan to "help the claws" of grain speculators.

COUPLE QUARREL, DOUBLE TRAGEDY

CHICAGO, Dec. 17.—During a quarrel over the date their marriage was to have taken place, John Novak today shot and seriously wounded Mrs. Mary Kolman and then killed himself. The tragedy occurred in the little south side home of Mrs. Kolman, where she lived with her three children and where Novak was a boarder. Mrs. Kolman was rushed to a hospital where it is believed she will die.

GENEVA, Dec. 17.—Roumania today asked the league of nations to send an international army to the relief of Armenia.

The Roumanian delegation presented to the league assembly a communication from the Roumanian government suggesting that an international expedition of 14,000 to 15,000 troops be sent to Armenia at once. Roumania offered to supply some of the soldiers.
