JAP SETTLEMENT MAY REST WITH CALIFORNIA

WASHINGTON, Dec. 29.—Final settlement of the controversy between the U. S. and Japan over the California law prohibiting Japanese from owning land, may rest with the state of California itself, it was learned at the state department today. Following informal announcement from the state department that one of the propositions being discussed in the conversations between Ambassador Shidehara and Rolan Morris, ambassador to Japan, was the question of the enactment of a new law in California. California members of congress arranged a meeting to be held tomorrow to discuss the advisability of proposing new legislation to their state government. While the state department announced that no definite agreement had been reached in the conversations with Japan Rep. Kahn, of California, today stated he was of the opinion that Japan has withdrawn her opposition to the recently enacted law prohibiting Japanese from acquiring land in California. Rep. Kahn made this statement following a conference with Ambassador Morris. It was indicated, however, that if Japan has withdrawn her opposition it is only tentatively, pending the enactment of new laws by California covering the subject of land ownership. 
