Proceedings of the board of supervisors Wednesday, November 11, 1914, being the 3rd day of the November session. The board met pursuant to adjournment. Members all present, President J. R. Stodghill in the chair. The minutes of last meeting read and approved. The following resolution was unanimously adopted:

Resolution. Ottumwa, Iowa, Nov. 11, 1914. The board of supervisors of the county of Wapello, in the state of Iowa, met in regular session, pursuant to law, to the rules of said board, and to adjournment. The meeting was called to order by the chairman and the roll being called there were present—J. R. Stodghill, chairman, in the chair, and the following named supervisors: H. B. Patterson and J. W. Hall; Absent, none. Supervisors H. B. Patterson introduced and read the resolution next hereinafter set out, and after due consideration thereof by the board, the chairman put the question upon the adoption of said resolution, and the roll being called, the following named supervisors voted—Aye, Stodghill, Patterson and Hall. Nays—None. Whereupon the chairman declared said resolution duly adopted as follows:

Whereas, The county of Wapello, in the state of Iowa, is indebted on valid obligations of said county in the amount of over \$35,000, none of which obligations were issued for bridge purposes, each of which obligations was outstanding on the first day of September, 1914, is now outstanding, and is now payable; now therefore,

Be it resolved, by the board of supervisors of the county of Wapello, in the state of Iowa, that said obligations to the amount of \$25,000 be hereby called for payment; and the county treasurer is hereby directed to notify the last known holders and owners of said obligations of said call for payment.

Whereas, the county of Wapello, in the state of Iowa, is a body corporate duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws and constitution of the state of Iowa; and

Whereas, None of said indebtedness or obligations has ever been adjudicated to be invalid and no litigation is pending, prayed or threatened involving the validity of any of said indebtedness, or obligations and said indebtedness thus evidenced by said obligations is a legal, valid and binding obligation of said county; and

Whereas, It is deemed to be the best interest of said county to fund said outstanding indebtedness, evidenced by said obligations, outstanding on the first day of September, 1914, and now outstanding to the amount of \$35,000; and

Whereas, The amount, nature and condition of the indebtedness of said county now is, and was at the time of contracting and of incurring each item of said indebtedness, including such item, and at the time of the issuance of each of said obligations, including such obligation, such that according to the last previous state and county tax lists no portion of said county now is, or was at any of said times, chargeable with taxation (either levied or necessary after wards to be levied) to pay for the payment of said obligations, and no other purpose whatever.

Section 1. That—For the purpose of funding the indebtedness of said county in the amount of \$35,000, referred to and proposed to be funded in the preamble of this resolution and evidenced by obligations each of which was outstanding on the first day of September, 1914, and is now outstanding and has been called for payment—there are hereby authorized to be issued thirty-five (35), negotiable funding bonds of said county of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) each, numbered consecutively from one (1) to thirty-five (35), both numbers inclusive, to be dated the second day of November, 1914, each bearing interest from and after the date thereof until paid at the rate of five per centum (5%) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of May and November, in each year, upon presentation and surrender of the interest coupons here-to attached as they severally become due. Both principal and interest of this bond are hereby irrevocably pledged.

Section 2. The bonds hereby authorized shall be in form and recitals substantially as follows: (Form of bond.) No. _____ \$1,000. UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, STATE OF IOWA, COUNTY OF WAPELLO, FUNDING BOND.

The county of Wapello, in the state of Iowa, for value received promises to pay to bearer ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS, lawful money of the United States of America, on the first day of November, 19____, together with interest on said sum from the date hereof until paid at the rate of five per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of May and November in each year, upon presentation and surrender of the interest coupons here-to attached as they severally become due. Both principal and interest of this bond are hereby irrevocably pledged.

Section 3. The bonds hereby authorized shall be signed by the chairman of the board of supervisors and attested by the county auditor, with the county seal affixed, and the coupons thereto attached shall be executed with the fac-simile signature of the county auditor; and said bonds, with coupons attached; when so executed, shall be delivered to the county treasurer to be by him sold and delivered to the purchaser thereof; and the proceeds thereof shall be used only for the purpose aforesaid; and said bonds may be exchanged for said outstanding obligations, par for par; and in any event, said outstanding obligations so paid or exchanged shall be cancelled simultaneously with the delivery of the bonds hereby authorized; and the intention being to change but not to increase the indebtedness of said county.

Section 4. The board of supervisors shall annually levy a tax upon the taxable property within said county, in addition to the levy authorized for other purposes, a sufficient sum to pay the interest coupons on the bonds hereby authorized as and when the same mature, and also a special levy to pay the principal as required by law, and the moneys arising from such levies shall be known as the "Bond Fund series 1914," and shall be used for the payment of said interest coupons and said bonds and for no other purpose whatever.

Both principal and interest of this bond are hereby made payable at the banking house of the United States of America, on the first day of November, 19____, together with interest on said sum from the date hereof until paid at the rate of five per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of May and November, in each year, upon presentation and surrender of the interest coupons here-to attached as they severally become due.
