Thos. Bolin Dead.
Thos. Bolin, another of Bates county's oldest and most highly respected citizens, died at his home in Shawnee township, Saturday, August 10, 1918, of diseases incident to old age.
He was born in Montgomery county, Kentucky, January 8, 1843. He resided in Kentucky until he reached young manhood. At the outbreak of the Civil war he enlisted in the 8th Kentucky cavalry with which he served throughout the war. Soon after he returned home from the war he was united in marriage to Miss Annel Davis Hoskins, of Montgomery County, Kentucky. They removed to this state in 1881 and located in Henry county and a short time later came to Bates county and settled on a farm. After the death of his wife in January, 1914, he moved to this city, where he lived until last spring, when he again moved to the farm.
He is survived by four sons, Albert Bolin, Ray, Arizona; Green Bolin, Phoenix, Arizona; Sterling Bolin and D. S. Bolin, of this county; three daughters, Mrs. G. L. Johnson, Platte City, Missouri; and Misses Laura and Clara Bolin, who live at the family home in Shawnee township.
Funeral services were conducted at the home Wednesday afternoon by H. O. Maxey and the remains laid to rest in Oak Hill cemetery.

Missouri Crop Report, August 1, 1918.
Jefferson City, Mo., Aug. 10.—That Missouri's victory crop of spring and winter wheat threshes out 49,153,000 bushels, and that our corn crop has dropped to 185,439,470 bushels losing \$66,000,000, is shown by the August crop report announced here today by E. A. Logan and Jewell Mayes of the United States Department and State Board of Agriculture, detailing the August 1st conditions by counties and not including the drought damage of the past nine days.
In Bates County the total of the winter wheat crop at the threshing is 938,000 bushels. In Bates County the acre yield of oats is 23.1 bushels. In this County the conditions of crops in percentages of normal are as follows: Corn 57 per cent; potatoes, 57 per cent; apples, 30 per cent; hay, 70 per cent; pasture, 25 per cent.
Corn conditions in Missouri is 74 against 81 in July, 88 in June, 15 points below August, 1917, yet 12 points above August 1916, and one point above August 1915, the wettest of recent years.
The greatest loss from heat occurred in west district, 28 points. Southwest district lost 26 points. South central lost 25 points. Central district lost 23 points.
Since the above figures were compiled the hot, dry weather has continued and it is probable that the percentages will now fall far below those given for August 1.

Former Bates County Boy Killed in France.
George McDaniel, of Miller county, who was visiting last week at the home of his brother, J. B. H. McDaniel, received a cablegram that his son, Charles McDaniel, had been killed on the battle line in France July 14. Young McDaniel was 22 years of age. His father was informed by the war department that the body would be sent to the United States at the close of the war. The McDaniels family formerly lived at Rich Hill.
