**Republican County Convention.**

A Republican County Convention for the county of Beltrami will be held at the City Hall in the village of Bemidji on the 2nd day of June, A. D. 1901, at 10 o'clock p. m. for the purpose of electing ten (10) delegates to the State Convention to be held at the City of St. Paul on the 26th day of June, A. D. 1901, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of placing in nomination candidates for the following state offices:

Four justices of the supreme court.  
 Lieutenant Governor.  
 Secretary of State.  
 State Treasurer.  
 Attorney General.  
 Two railroad and warehouse commissioners.  
 Eleven presidential electors.  
 and for the transaction of any other business that may properly come before the convention.

The primary election of delegates to attend the Republican County Convention will be held in the several voting precincts on the 24th day of June, A. D. 1901, at one o'clock p. m. and shall be kept open for two hours at a place to be designated by the next day's public meeting.

Representation in this convention will be made on the following basis:

Each precinct shall be entitled to one delegate for each twenty-five votes or major fraction thereof cast for the republican candidate for governor in the year 1902 in such precinct and each precinct shall be allowed

**The Charter Election.**

The Pioneer sincerely hopes that failure of the council last evening to set the date for the charter election is not an indication that that body intends to let the election go by default.

Whether the charter submitted by the commission is what Bemidji wants or not, we believe that the matter should be submitted to the people. This is not a matter in which the council can afford to be an obstructionist. To refuse to put the charter before the people at this time would certainly place the council in an unfavorable position. We are confident that those members of the council, if any, who oppose submission at the present time are sincere in their motives but we are equally confident that failure to submit would be unwise. The city needs a charter and the quicker the better. If the charter submitted is the right one let us find it out and adopt it at once. If it is not the right one let us find that out too and get to work on making the right one.

At the council meeting last evening the proposition was advanced that submission of the charter should be delayed until next year in order that the present council might carry out the work it has undertaken in providing adequate water works for the city—in a word that it would be unwise to change the personnel of the city government while so important a matter was in process of execution. The Pioneer concedes that there is strength in this argument but if the submission of the charter is to be delayed until every objection is met it will never be submitted. Moreover if the charter is adopted quite it is probable the present council will constitute a portion of the new body and the work of installing the water works system would go on without interruption. A further consideration is that by the time the new government could go into force the work of installing the new plant would be well under way.

It is now more than six months since the work of preparing a charter was undertaken. The charter is completed and printed and with a suitable time left for discussion the people of the city are ready to adopt it or reject it. There is grave danger that if no action is taken for several months all labor and expense already expended will be lost.

Above all other considerations Bemidji needs a city organization. The Pioneer cannot believe that it is wise to postpone deciding whether the proposed charter is adequate or not for nearly a year.

**TEST IS SUCCESSFUL.**

**Submarine Boat Remains Under Water Twelve Hours.**

Newport, R. I., June 8.—The submarine torpedo boat Fulton, which was sunk to the bottom of the ocean for a test, remained there over twelve hours. The men were on duty in batches of two hours each, the remainder of the time being spent in reading, playing games and sleeping. All the members of the crew were in good condition and appeared to have rested well. By order of the trial board fresh air was pumped in every four hours.

Naval Constructor Woodward said that the test was in every way satisfactory. Hitherto only six men had gone below for any length of time, but on the Fulton there were nine men and they could have stayed in the boat under water ten days without coming to the surface.

**PREPARING TO BEGIN WORK.**

**Canal Commission Employing Laborers and Mechanics.**

Panama, June 8.—Major Black, head of the engineering department of the Panama canal, expects to leave Panama soon. All the laborers and mechanics applying for work at Culebra have been employed. The work is organized in a style different from that of the French company and will enable the laborers to do the maximum amount of work.

The Panama sectionhouses, where the canal commission will reside, are being repaired.

**ELECTION IN OREGON.**

**Both Republican Congressional Candidates Successful.**

Portland, Ore., June 8.—At 9 o'clock p. m. it was conceded that the Republicans have elected their congressional candidates by heavy majorities. Congressman Binger Herman, the Republican candidate, has probably carried the district over R. M. Veatch, Dem., by from 5,000 to 7,000. John H. Williamson of Prineville, the Republican candidate in the Second district, will carry the district by probably 10,000 over J. E. Simmons, Dem.

**STRIKERS RETURN TO WORK.**

**Eveleth Miners Bring About a Renewal of Business.**

Duluth, June 8.—The striking strippers at Eveleth have decided to return to work and the Drake & Stratton company has started up its stripping operations again. A number of the men will leave rather than accept the lower wages, but the great majority are at work. Efforts of the business men of Eveleth has had considerable effect in shaping the result.

**FLOODS HAVE CAUSED GENERAL SUSPENSION ABOUT DEADWOOD.**

Deadwood, S. D., June 8.—The weather has cleared in the Black Hills and the waters have subsided. Practically every mine in Lawrence county is closed down. All the cyanide plants in Deadwood are shut down. Hundreds of men are idle.

**Brother and Sister Drown.**

Ashland, Wis., June 8.—Louis Larson, aged sixteen years, and his sister, Nellie, aged fourteen, were drowned near Mellen while boat riding in Meter lake. In some unknown manner the girl accidentally fell overboard and her brother jumped in after her, but she threw her arms around her and dragged him down, both drowning in sight of many people on shore.
