

Now therefore be it resolved, that said petition be received, filed and accepted, and that the boundaries of said new town be the boundaries of said Government or Congressional township, and that notice be at once given designating the residence of A. C. Gordon in said township as the place for holding the first town meeting of said town, and that Monday the 1st day of August 1904 between the hours of 9 a. m. and 5 p. m. be fixed as the time for holding the first meeting of said town, and that report of the proceedings be filed with the county auditor.

The following resolution introduced by Commissioner Wright was adopted. Whereas a majority of the legal voters of the Congressional or Government township 160 north range 21 west in said county containing more than twenty-five legal voters, have petitioned the board of county commissioners requesting that the said town be organized as a body politic corporate.
Now therefore be it resolved, that said petition be received, filed and accepted, and that the boundaries of said new town be the boundaries of said Government or Congressional township, and that notice be at once given designating the residence of A. C. Resolved, that all that part of township 148, range 35, and consisting of sections 25, 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30 not included in or attached to any organized school district in said district is hereby attached to and made a part of School District No. 92 in said township.
On motion the board adjourned to meet at 2 o'clock p. m.

Resolved, That \$300 be and it is hereby appropriated out of the county road and bridge fund to the town of Taylor for building roads and bridges.

On motion, the board of G. J. Strander & Co with A. B. Hazen and Fred M. Dudley as sureties was approved.

Moved by Commissioner McDougald seconded by Commissioner Wright.
Resolved, that appropriations be and they are hereby made out of the county road and bridge fund to the town of Taylor for building roads and bridges in said town in the following amounts: Comant \$300; Battle \$300; Sholey \$200; and Koller \$200.

On motion, the application of the board of supervisors of the town of Maple Ridge for \$300 out of the county road and bridge fund to add the said town in building roads was approved and allowed.
Moved by Commissioner Johnson, seconded by Commissioner Anderson, that \$150 be and it is hereby appropriated out of the county road and bridge fund to the town of Jones

to be expended in covering corduroy on county road over section 4 in town of Jones and section 38 in town of Lammons.
On motion the board adjourned to meet at 10 o'clock a. m. July 12 '04.
Board reconvened as per adjournment.
On motion Commissioner Anderson was authorized and instructed to advertise for bids and to contract for and on behalf of this board for building corduroy on a certain town road in the town of Northern in its range between sections 25, 26, 27, 28 and 29 and 10 and 11 in said town.
On motion, the bid of Boyd and Erickson for a red sandstone cement fence around courthouse grounds at \$1.30 per foot be accepted and approved.
The following resolution moved by Commissioner Johnson seconded by Commissioner Wright was adopted.
Whereas it appears that one N. O. Dahl and his daughter Agost Dahl have been murdered in this county, and that the guilty parties have not been discovered, or the bodies of Dahl and his daughter recovered, and that the sheriff and county attorney have exhausted all means in their power to discover said bodies, and to punish the parties guilty of said crime.
Resolved, that the county attorney be authorized to take out a writ of habeas corpus for the sum of Five Dollars, in addition to the sum heretofore appropriated for his continued duty, and to cause to be made a best, in attempting to discover and punish the parties guilty of said crime, and to find the bodies of the said Dahl, subject to the approval of the District Judge, and the provisions of chapter 33, Laws of 1903.
