

The following report was read and on motion approved.

To the Hon. Board of County Commissioners of Beltrami County, Minnesota:

In regard to the present condition of the Grass Lake ditch, I wish to report as follows:

The upper mile is, in most places, from six inches to a foot above grade and the lower mile is down to grade and in other respects satisfactory, except perhaps that some of the embankment in one cut is too close to the edge of the ditch.

However, in as much as the railroad culvert has not as yet been lowered to grade through no fault of Contractor Jenkinson, there will be more or less sand wash down the ditch and lodge when said culvert is lowered. I would therefore not urge the ditch completion after said culvert is lowered, but to grade, and would also recommend that you allow to be paid to said contractor the balance of the money due him under his contract, excepting and withholding \$400 for the prompt completion of the ditch, as soon as said culvert is lowered, the said amount being \$300 in excess of the actual cost of completing said ditch according to specifications.

**INVOLVES LOSS OF \$200,000.**

Newport Residence Robbed of Valuable Jewels.

New York, Aug. 9.—The most extensive jewelry robbery ever perpetrated in this country, involving a loss of \$200,000, is reported by the Herald to be engaging the attention of the police and scores of private detectives in Eastern cities. Great secrecy surrounds the robbery, which appears to have been committed about June 21 in the Newport residence of a prominent New Yorker whose name is withheld. Diamonds and other precious stones valued at the sum mentioned are missing. The matter has only become public through the publication of a list of the missing jewels. He was cautioned, however, to exercise care and discretion in pursuing the investigation.

In this first consultation the theory was advanced that the robbery had been committed by some one on the inside, or, in other words, by a person who knew of the existence of the jewels as well as their great value and who may have had easy access at times.

Only the larger and most important gems are mentioned in the list, and there is said to be authority for the statement that the total value of the stolen articles will reach \$200,000.
