The output of the state prison twine plant this year was over 10,000,000 pounds.

In a recent county seat fight in Benton county, Ivanhoe won out by a vote of 1,131 to 947.

Crookston is advocating the establishment of a creamery or cheese factory at that place.

School district treasurer, of District No. 69, Polk county is short \$214 and an investigation is pending to find out why.

Roseau has a scarcity of dwelling houses and the Times believes some one should put a up few buildings to rent as an investment.

Two young men who were careless with firearms were fined ten dollars for accidentally shooting and wounding Mrs. McMannis, of Brainerd.

Light, or no light is the most interesting topic of conversation at Browerville, and the District Judge will decide the question at St. Cloud Aug. 24.

An Iowa farmer's will has recently been filed with the Probate court of Polk county and therein he bequeaths \$20,000, but an important clause in the will is that the widow shall not remarry.

The trustees of Ansgar College, of Hutchinson, have made an assignment for the benefit of creditors. The college will probably continue to run and means provided to meet the \$15,000 indebtedness which is crowding the institution.

The Eveleth strike has been temporarily settled and the men have again gone to work. As yet the matter of wages with the strippers has not been settled. At present strippers get \$1.60 per day, which is considered too low for a place where everything else is high.

TAKAHIRA VISITS HAY.

Secretary and Minister Discuss Chefoo Incident.

Washington, Aug. 15.—Mr. Takahira, the Japanese minister here, had a conference with Secretary Hay during the day, discussing the questions growing out of the war and particularly the Chefoo incident involving the cutting out of the Russian torpedo boat destroyer Ryeshitleni. The minister has as yet had no formal report from the government on the subject and deems it necessary to have the details at hand before expressing an opinion on the rights of the seizure.

It is said at the state department that by no possibility can the department be involved in obliging China, Japan or Russia to execute faithfully the terms of the agreement entered into with the powers at the beginning of the war regarding the protection of the neutrality of China and the limitation of the field of war.

ROOSEVELT WILL NOT SPEAK.

The President Will Deliver No Political Addresses This Year.

New York, Aug. 15.—Chairman Cortelyou said Friday that President Roosevelt would not make any political speeches this year, setting at rest many rumors to that effect that have been in circulation. Beyond the speech to the notification committee and the letter of acceptance, which is yet to be published, the president will not take any public part in the campaign. This is in line with the course pursued by President McKinley in 1900.

President Roosevelt has placed the political campaign in the hands of Mr. Cortelyou and while there may be conversations between them, it is well understood that the national chairman is in absolute control and that in all political matters he takes the full responsibility.


