

PROCEEDINGS

OF THE
County Board of Equalization
of Beltrami County, Minnesota,
Regular Session.

Bemidji, Minn., July 18, 1904.

The Board of Equalization met at the auditor's office as required by law. Members present, Commissioners F. O. Sibley, E. R. Anderson, A. O. Johnson, John McDonald and Wes Wright and County Auditor D. L. Sylvester.

After having taken the oath required by law, the Board proceeded to examine and compare the different assessment returns. Persons and companies whose assessment returns for personal property that appeared to be less than 50 per cent of actual cash value were given notice to show cause why the same should not be raised.

The Board adjourned from day to day for eight days completing its labors on July 27.

After reviewing the suggested changes upon Assessments and persons representing various interests in the different parts of the county, the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, That the assessment returns as made by the town and village assessors as left by the Board of Assessors be and they are hereby changed as follows:

L. L. Berman, Village of Bemidji, personal property, class 16, raised 25%.

V. E. Sorenson, St. Paul, Minn., assessed for \$508, class 16, Village of Bemidji, musical instruments.

Franklin Co. assessed \$250, class 28, Village of Bemidji.

Town of Kellier, assessment under class 17, cancelled except as to H. Gietter, C. F. Rogers, Selkoe Merc Co and J. M. Twomey for the reason that these assessments covered land located too far from market to be of any value for assessment purposes.

Town of Kellier, plat lots reduced 75 per cent.

Bank of Kellier, Town of Kellier, reduced \$500 under class 21, personal property. Buildings and structures on plat lots in the town of Kellier reduced 25 per cent.

Assessment for structures on Gov. lot 30, sec 24, twp 150 rge 35, \$300, cancelled.

Personal property assessment of J. J. Opsahl in the town of Port Hope, reduced to \$500.

Value of real estate except plat lots exclusive of structures changed by towns as follows:

Turtle River township raised 20 per cent; Port Hope raised ten per cent; Summit raised 20 per cent; Northern raised 10 per cent; Bemidji township raised 50 per cent; Lammers, sections 1 to 18, raised to \$2.50 per acre; Village of Tenstrike, center raised 100 per cent; Frohn raised 50 per cent; Jones reduced 10 per cent; Lanoor reduced 40 per cent; Bekke reduced 20 per cent; Kellier reduced 25 per cent.

Structures on Lot 11, block 22 townsite of Bemidji reduced \$300.

Structures on lots 11 and 12 block 6, townsite of Bemidji raised \$200 each.

White-Street Townsite Co exempted for assessment on 20 acres in sec 4 town 146 range 35, the same being leased to the Beltrami County Agricultural Association for five years.

Value of lands exclusive of structures in township 150 range 34, reduced 20% per cent. Valley & Kelly assessed for 10 million ft of logs @ \$4 per thousand ft in the village of Bemidji, said logs being destined for manufacture in said village.

Crookston Lumber Co raised \$28,000 under class 17 personal property in the Village of Bemidji.

Real Estate exclusive of structures sections 1 and 2 township 146 range 35 reduced 20 per cent.

T. B. Walker assessment for logs, class 17, Village of Tenstrike center, cancelled, said logs being destined for manufacture in the city of Minneapolis.

Personal property of Willis Nye, class 16, in the Village of Nymer reduced to \$500.

Assessment on lot 16 range 33 reduced to \$5 per acre.

Assessments against Gov. lots 2, 3, 4, and new 4, sec 7, township 146, range 35, reduced to \$60 for each description.

On motion, the board adjourned.

FRESH RAVAGES OF RUST.

Report Causes Further Advance in Price of Wheat.

Chicago, Aug. 22.--In heated trading on the board of trade the price of wheat for May delivery took a fresh jump of 2 cents a bushel. For a few seconds \$1.18 1/4 a bushel was paid freely and in that brief time several million bushels changed hands. The source of the strength was emphasized reports of fresh ravages of black rust in the wheat fields of the Northwest. The close for May delivery was \$1.15 1/4, or half a cent under the top price for the day, and a net advance of 1 1/4 cents.

FOR TRAINING OF NEGROES.

Lutheran Conference Decides to Build College Near Concord, N. C.

Winona, Minn., Aug. 22.--The Lutheran synodical conference of North America has decided to erect a college for the training of negroes for mission work in the South near Concord, N. C., and decided to appropriate from \$10,000 to \$15,000 for the purchase of a tract of land of from 50 to 100 acres at that place for this purpose. The conference also decided on some minor changes in the English catechism for the use of the negroes of the South.

President at Oyster Bay.

Washington, Aug. 22.--President Roosevelt left Washington at 10 a. m. for Oyster Bay. The president's party was carried on a special train of two cars run as the second section of the regular 10 o'clock train on the Pennsylvania. Oyster Bay was reached at 5:30 p. m.

Explorer's Remains Exhumed.

Portage, Wis., Aug. 22.--While excavating for a new Baptist church parsonage the workmen have exhumed the remains of the famous explorer and trader, Pierre Piquette. Historians have been searching for years to discover his body.
