IF THE people of northern Minnesota knew one tenth of the things which Mr. Dunn has done for this part of the state, things which he has done without noise, never expecting that they would be generally known, things which he has done simply because he believed that they would result in advancing the welfare of the whole state, things which in the aggregate have had a wonderful influence in the development of northern Minnesota and which have put hundreds of dollars into the pocket of every homesteader, every merchant, every resident of northern Minnesota—if the people knew one tenth of these things Mr. Dunn would get every vote in northern Minnesota, republican, democratic and populist alike.

ANY man who aspires to be the governor of Minnesota should have rendered some services to the state which prove his worth and which clearly demonstrate that he is such a man as should be entrusted with the grave responsibilities of the highest office within the gift of the people of the state. Tried by this test, the democratic nominee is found utterly wanting. The best thing which the democratic party in Minnesota has to say for their candidate for governor is that he is "a nice fellow," that he has managed a newspaper with fair success and that he has served in the state senate without attracting much attention from anybody. This record is a credit to the democratic nominee, but there is in it all not the vestige of anything which would entitle him to the vote of a single person in the state.

THE Pioneer is not an advocate of capital punishment but one strong argument against simple life imprisonment is that so long as the criminal is alive his friends will never cease their efforts to secure his freedom and there are nine chances out of ten that the man sentenced for life will never pay the penalty pronounced by the law. Here is the Minnesota state board of pardons at this very time wrestling with over 100 applications for pardon. There is certainly room for a wonderful improvement in our penal system.

It looks as though the state might as well dismiss its case against Ex-Mayor Ames. If there are 5000 voters in Minneapolis who want Dr. Ames to go to congress it will be pretty hard to get a jury of twelve men that does not include one or more of these five thousand and a man who will vote to send Ames to Congress will never vote to send him to the penitentiary.
