Business Destroying Campaign.

The campaign just ended has been a long one and a damaging one to the business interests of the country. That business has suffered no more than it has evidence that the tide of trade is still flowing strong throughout the country.

About a year ago there were heard the first mutterings of an active opposition to President Roosevelt. Wall street was opposed to his re-election and it determined to put forth an effort to defeat him for re-nomination. To that end it began a systematic attack upon the business interests of the country. Had Roosevelt not been so strong, there might have been a mild financial panic. But Wall street soon discovered that it was attempting the impossible, and it abandoned open warfare.

At about the same time the state campaign for governor began to open and it is safe to say that few states have been so torn with political dissension as has Minnesota for the past year. Every business man will rejoice that the campaign is ended. With its end there is evidence that business will begin again with renewed activity and that the immediate future will be a most active one in the business world.

Now that we have got done electing other fellows to office, maybe we shall have a little time to spare for our own affairs. There is the matter of good roads out of this city into the country for instance. The Pioneer is aware that the city has already done something in this direction but we are persuaded that ten times as much and more can be done with profit. There are few things that will bring a town as good returns as good roads built into the country. They are a means of fastening the country trade to the city for ever and their influence in settling and developing the country tributary to a city is in proportion to the length and excellence of the roads. The size of the territory which a town may annex is also in the same proportion. This will be a most fruitful matter for the Business Men's Club to investigate this winter.
