JOHNSON IS ELECTED BY LARGE PLURALITY

DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATE FOR GOVERNOR OF MINNESOTA SECURES PLURALITY.

ROOSEVELT CARRIES STATE BY 100,000

REPUBLICANS ELECT NINE CONGRESSMEN AND BALANCE OF STATE TICKET.

LA FOLLETTE WINS IN WISCONSIN

DEFEATS RIVAL CANDIDATES BY A PLURALITY OF OVER FIFTY THOUSAND.

St. Paul, Nov. 10.—Many of the returns from the eighty-four counties of Minnesota are incomplete, but enough have been received to indicate that Johnson, Dem., has been elected governor of Minnesota by a plurality of not less than 8,000. The agricultural counties where Dunn expected to lead Johnson by a heavy vote failed to realize his anticipations, while the iron range and lumber sections gave him a greater vote than his managers have estimated.

The Republicans elected the balance of the state ticket, including the supreme court justices, by good majorities.

Roosevelt carried the state by nearly 100,000 and the Republicans elected all of the nine congressmen by increased majorities. There was really no contest except in the Fifth district, but Loren Fletcher was chosen by a majority of about 5,000. The eight other congressmen were re-elected.

LA FOLLETTE IS VICTORIOUS

ROOSEVELT SECURES 343 ELECTORAL VOTES TO 133 FOR JUDGE PARKER.

REPUBLICANS INVADE SOLID SOUTH

LATEST RETURNS INDICATE MISSOURI HAS ABANDONED THE DEMOCRACY.

DECISIVE PLURALITIES EVERYWHERE

PRESENT CHIEF EXECUTIVE RECEIVES LARGEST POPULAR VOTE ON RECORD.

New York, Nov. 10.—The indications are that President Roosevelt will have 343 electoral votes to 133 for Parker, a plurality of 210.

With every former doubtful state admittedly in the Roosevelt column, with majorities in some states in excess of those given Mr. McKinley four years ago and in some instances even greater than those of 1896, latest returns indicate that the solid South has been broken into by the state of Missouri casting its ballot for a Republican president.

Beginning with the tremendous majority of 400,000 in Pennsylvania the Republican pluralities are decisive in nearly every state carried for their ticket and it seems probable that Roosevelt has received the greatest popular vote ever given a presidential candidate. Returns thus far received indicate that he will receive a popular plurality of slightly over 1,300,000, against 849,790 for McKinley over Bryan.

REPUBLICANS SWEEP STATE.

Roosevelt Secures 60,000 Plurality in New Jersey.

Trenton, N. J., Nov. 10.—Roosevelt's plurality in this state will reach 60,000 and Stokes, the Republican candidate for governor, has defeated Black, Dem., by at least 40,000. The representation in congress from this state will be nine Republicans and one Democrat.

Democratic Plurality in Florida.

Jacksonville, Fla., Nov. 10.—Indications are that the Democratic plurality will be about 20,000.

Texas Votes for Parke.

Dallas, Tex., Nov. 10.—Texas gave Parke a majority of 190,000.

JAPS MAKE ADVANCES.

Completely Silence Several Forts at Port Arthur.

Tokio, Nov. 10.—It is reported that the Japanese have completely silenced the forts on Rihlung and Susing mountains and that their main strength is now attacking Etse mountain.

Big Plurality in Oregon.

Portland, Ore., Nov. 9.—Roosevelt's plurality in Oregon will probably exceed 40,000, twice the majority given any presidential candidate in the state in any election held in the past. The returns indicate that the question of prohibition, which was submitted to the voters of twenty-three counties, has been overwhelmingly defeated.

Light Vote in Virginia.

Richmond, Va., Nov. 10.—The vote in Virginia was light, probably not exceeding 60 per cent of that cast in 1900. The Democratic majority on the presidential ticket is estimated at between 20,000 and 25,000. Nine of the ten Democratic nominees for congress were elected.

Democratic Majority in Georgia.

Atlanta, Ga., Nov. 10.—Returns from the remote counties of Georgia are coming in slowly, but there seems no reason so far to change the result announced before of a total vote of about 90,000, with a Democratic majority for the presidential ticket of 40,000.

STATEMENT BY ROOSEVELT.

President Deeply Sensible of the Honor Done Him.

Washington, Nov. 10.—President Roosevelt, after the election returns clearly indicated the result, issued the following statement:

"I am deeply sensible of the honor done me by the American people in thus expressing their confidence in what I have done and have tried to do. I appreciate to the full the solemn responsibility this confidence imposes upon me and I shall do all that in my power lies not to forfeit it. On the fourth of March next I shall have served three and one-half years and this three and one-half years constitutes my first term. The wise custom which limits the president to two terms regards the substance and not the form. Under no circumstances will I be a candidate for another nomination."
