Clapp's Re-election.

The recent state campaign has made the re-election of Senator Clapp abundantly certain.

To any one who has been a careful political observer during the past few months it will be perfectly evident that powerful influence has been at work to defeat the junior senator. That Joel Heatwole actively hoped to succeed Senator Clapp no man can now dispute. He tried to make the republican nominee for governor a tool to this end, but failed. That the big corporate interests of Minneapolis were equally intent upon naming Thomas Lowry as Senator Nelson's colleague is also apparent. For instance, it may be remembered, that in all its wild fears that Dunn would not support Clapp, the Minneapolis Journal never by so much as a suspicion of a letter of the alpha bet declared its loyalty to Clapp. Other evidences are as easy to be had.

The state campaign proved too hot however, and Messrs. Heatwole and Lowry have simply succeeded in making Senator Clapp the stronger.

An Important Session.

The session of the legislature this winter will be one of the most important held in Minnesota. Men and measures will both be made during the session and the winter of 1905 will have much to do with the future history of the state.

There are a number of important measures which will come up for amendment along the lines suggested by the experience of the past few years. Among these are the primary election law and the board of control bill. The state has now fairly entered upon a policy of liberal appropriations for drainage and it is expected that some far reaching measures on this subject will be presented and passed. The matter of tax revision is one that cannot longer be delayed and the legislature this winter must make some definite provision for it.

The chief public interest of the session will center about a few measures of this kind. The people are intensely interested in these things and the legislature will be much in every man's eye next January and February.

EVERY "silk stocking" precinct in the twin cities went for Johnson. Every precinct in which the plain, working people lived went for Dunn. Under the circumstances we are not at all ashamed of having given our ardent support to Mr. Dunn.

NORTHERN Minnesota has the keenest interest in the meeting of the legislature this winter. The twin subjects of drainage and good roads is one upon which this section of the state confidently expects radical legislation.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE Board of County Commissioners of Beltrami County, Minnesota, Adjourned Session.

Bemidji, Minn., Sept. 9, 1904.

Board of county commissioners met in adjourned session. All members present.

On motion a resolution appropriating \$500 to the Beltrami County Agricultural society adopted by this board at a meeting held Aug. 11, 1904, is hereby rescinded.

On motion by Commissioner Wright seconded by Commissioner Johnson the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, that there be and there is hereby appropriated out of the county revenue fund to the town of Frodo to be expended as follows: \$50 between sections 11 and 12 and \$50 on range line between said town and Frodo beginning at southeast corner section 24 and running south.

On motion by Commissioner Johnson seconded by Commissioner Wright \$500 was appropriated out of the county road and bridge fund to be expended on the town of Frodo to be expended as follows: \$50 between sections 11 and 12 and \$50 on range line between said town and Frodo beginning at southeast corner section 24 and running south.

On motion the petition of Mrs. Minnie Sharp and others praying that certain territory in the town of Jones be organized as a new school district was approved and accepted and on motion the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, that sections 10, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 31, 32, 33 and 34 in township 146 north of range 35 west be and the same is hereby organized as school district no. 7.

On motion the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved, that in the event of appointment of the Bemidji Independent Military company receiving appointment as a company of the National Guard of Minnesota, the same and hereby is allowed the use of the northwestern corner of the court house of Beltrami county as a depository for its equipments and supplies until a more suitable place can be obtained.

On motion an order was made and filed with the county auditor establishing section 33 town 147 range 34 running thence north through the town of Liberty thence west and then on motion with the Solway and Red Lake county road.

On motion an order was made and filed laying out and establishing a county road beginning at northwest corner of township 161 north of range 34 west thence running east to the northeast corner of section 1 township 169 north of range 31.

On motion an order was made and filed laying out and establishing a county road beginning at northwest corner of section 21 township 147 range 34 and running thence through said town into town of Port Hope and terminating at 1/4 section corner between sections 20 and 22 of said town.

On motion the petition of Wm. Zippie and others praying that a voting precinct be established was accepted and approved.
