SLEEPING CARS OF NEW DESIGN FOR ST. PAUL LINE

Drawing Room Will Be in Center
of Car Instead of Over the
Trucks, Making Riding Easier
and More Comfortable.

The Milwaukee & St. Paul, one
of the three roads in the United
States owning and operating its
own sleeping cars, announces an
innovation in the construction of
equipment of the Pioneer Limited
trains between Chicago, St.
Paul and Minneapolis.

In the new cars just placed in
commission, the drawing room
will be in the center instead of at
the ends of the cars. These are
the first cars after such a pattern
ever constructed, and the change
is made to afford easier riding
and additional comfort for travel-
ers using these departments.
Hitherto drawing rooms
have always been over the trucks
at either end, which, in the opinion
of many, is a rough place to
ride. The new cars will be com-
partments throughout. Two of
the cars have been named Ona-
laska and Ontonagoe, are finished
and will be put in service at once.
