ALL VALUABLES SECURED.

Details of Raid by Chinese Pirates on Standard Oil Launch.

Hongkong, March 26.-Details of the capture and looting by Chinese pirates March 22 near Canton of a launch owned by the Standard Oil company have been obtained. The langer Comet was proceeding to Kongmun, between Wampoa and Canton, towing a lighter laden with kerosene oil. While passing what is known as the "second barrier," or second line of former obstructions to navigation, and when in sight of Wampoa fort, on the island of Wampoa, a number of junks manned by pirates closed around the Comet and her tow. A stinkpot (earthen jar containing gunpowder, rosin and hand grenades) was thrown into her en gineroom, the pirates boarded the launch and her crew were overpowered. The pirates then beached the Comet and the lighter and removed all the valuables from the two vessels. including a number of Winchester rifles and 1,600 rounds of ammunition. The cargo of kerosene was not touched.

The pirates, it appears, missed capturing much more valuable booty. was the intention of the Standard Oil company's officials to ship \$20,000 in specie on the Comet on her last trip, but the shipment of specie was trans-

ferred to a freight steamer. The American consular officials are investigating the affair.
