Carleton College Gets \$100,000 From Rockefeller Fund.

New York, Jan. 26.—The general education board, established by John D. Rockefeller to handle a fund of \$10,000,000 from which to assist universities and colleges and pension teachers, held its eighth annual meeting in this city.

Eight institutions, which had not benefited previously, received allotments this year, and two already on the board's lists got an appropriation. Carleton college at Northfield, Minn., receives \$100,000.
