The Lake Shore.

Under the supervision of Street Commissioner Carter, the park on the Lake shore at the foot of Third street is being made a thing of beauty. Steps are being built in the middle of the retaining wall so that it will not be necessary to jump the wall and tramp through flower beds to get to the boat houses. Crews from the lumber companies have been picking out the logs from in front of the park and in another two weeks, it will be one of the prettiest spots in the city.

To Pave the Nymore Road.

From the steps taken at the joint meeting of the Commercial club and council committees last night, it appears probable that in the near future the road from Bemidji to Nymore will be paved as far as the city limits. This step will be one of the most important taken by Bemidji in many years.

The condition of that road has been a bug bear year after year. Each spring a few hundred dollars have been spent on the road and the next there has been nothing to show for the money. A good pavement will make a highway that will allow the hauling of maximum loads and if laid properly, will not be calling for repairs each year.

A paved street from the M. and I freight depot to the city limits, connecting with the downtown pavements on Bemidji avenue will make a highway that will be the best built artery for travel into the city. Incidentally, it will eventually be a part of the trunk road from the twin cities north. In case a special election is called, the bonds should be voted.

Fight for Nelson's Seat.

With Senator Knute Nelson silent as to whether or not he will be a candidate for re-election to the United States senate, others with senatorial ambitions are busily mapping out the state and laying their wires for a campaign which may come later.

On Tuesday, James A. Peterson, of Minneapolis, announced that he will file for the office of United States senator to succeed Senator Nelson. Today word reached the Pioneer through authentic sources, that Congressman Lindberg, who is spoken of as the original progressive of Minnesota, will also file for the nomination. The nominee will be decided under the Keefe law primaries in September.

Whether or not Senator Nelson is a candidate for re-election, the state will see a merry fight before the primaries if both Lindberg and Peterson get in the race. Lindberg is a progressive, but has been close to Roosevelt in the campaign the latter is making for the presidential nomination from the Republican party. It appears to be generally believed that Lindberg would make a strong candidate for the support of the Roosevelt men in the state. Lindberg has a strong congressional record on which to stand.

On the other hand, Peterson has also been known as a progressive but has been in the LaFollette ranks and stumped for LaFollette principles in the recent state campaign. He has a record as city attorney of Minneapolis and served in the state legislature in 1901 and 1902. In his file for the nomination, Peterson said that he would make public his views in detail at a future time.

Both men are good and either would make a worthy senator.
