DETAILS OF TOUR ARE KEPT SECRET

Roosevelt to Be Guarded From English Militants.

BUT ONE PUBLIC FUNCTION

Extensive List of Private Entertainments Planned in Honor of the Colonel During His Approaching Visit to England.

London, June 12.—Fears of suffragette activities have caused the withholding from publication in London of a list of Colonel Roosevelt's engagements during his approaching visit to England. Except for his lecture before the Royal Geographical society Colonel Roosevelt, at his own request, will take no part in public functions while in London. An extensive list of private entertainments has been arranged.

Sir Edward Grey, secretary of state for foreign affairs, is to give a luncheon in honor of Roosevelt on June 13 and on that occasion most of the leading members of the Liberal party will be present.

Walter Hines Page, American ambassador, is to entertain him at luncheon. The colonel is to spend the weekend at Chequers court, the country residence in Buckinghamshire of Arthur Hamilton Lee, a Unionist member of the house of commons, who is to be the host of the former president while he is in England. Among those invited to meet Colonel Roosevelt at Chequers court are Field Marshal

Roberts and his daughter; Owen Seaman, editor of Punch; John St. Lee Strachey, publisher of the Spectator, and Mrs. Strachey, and Sir Sidney Colvin.

ACCIDENT AT RAIL CROSSING

Auto Struck by Train and Four Persons Killed.

Omaha, June 12.—Union Pacific train No. 12, westbound, struck an automobile at a crossing one mile from Millard, instantly killing three persons, and the fourth, who was injured seriously, died in the hospital later. The dead are Oscar Krug of St. Louis, Carl Baer of Omaha, the chauffeur, Mr. Krug's fiancée, Miss Vivian Ash, and the latter's friend, Mrs. Meneth Thompson of Blair, Neb. All were well known here.

FEDERAL ATTORNEY INDICTED

District Lawyer for Hawaii Charged With Attempt to Shoot.

Honolulu, T. H., June 12.—Jeff M. McCarn, United States district attorney for Hawaii, is under indictment here by the territorial grand jury for assault with a deadly weapon.

The specification is that McCarn assaulted Claudius McBride, an attorney, with a weapon "obviously and imminently" dangerous to life. McCarn and McBride, opposing counsel, held an altercation on May 5 in a corridor of the federal building and it is alleged McCarn attempted to shoot McBride.
