

BIG LINERS SEEK SAFETY IN FLIGHT

New York, Aug. 7.—The presence close to the American coast of warships of the warring European nations, prepared to descend on and capture merchant vessels of their opposing belligerents, was shown in news of great Atlantic liners arriving at Halifax, N. S., and by reports by wireless of the warships' activities.

The fast Cunard liner *Mauretania*, with 1,500 passengers, and the White Star liner *Cedric* raced into the Canadian port presumably to escape pursuit by two German cruisers believed to be hovering in the vicinity of the Grand banks for just such prizes.

Madrid, Aug. 7.—A dispatch from the Canary islands says a British squadron has sunk one German cruiser, the name of which is not given, and has captured another, which is being conveyed to Gibraltar.

AUSTRIANS FAIL TO GET INTO SERVA

Belgrade, via London, Aug. 7.—The Austrian attempts to cross the River Save at Avala, nine miles from Belgrade, and at Obrenovac, sixteen miles to the southwest, have failed. The Servian volunteers crossed the river and hoisted the Servian flag at Dalarme.

Servian officials express the opinion that the passage of the Austrian troops through Servian territory has become impossible.

Grand Duke a Prisoner.

London, Aug. 7.—A dispatch to the Post from St. Petersburg says that the indignation in the Russian capital over the detention of the Dowager Empress Maria Feodorovna at Berlin has been increased by reports that Grand Duke Constantine, who was undergoing the cure at Wildungen, is being treated as a prisoner of war.

Captured Officers to Be Shot.

Brussels, Aug. 7.—Two disguised German officers arrested at Ostend had in their possession extensive military notes and plans of great value. They are to be shot.

THIRTY-EIGHT DEAD IN RAILWAY WRECK

Joplin, Mo., Aug. 7.—Thirty-eight persons are dead and more than a score injured, some fatally, as the result of a collision between a gasoline motor car of the Missouri and North Arkansas railway and a passenger train on the tracks of the Kansas City Southern railway, eleven miles south of this city.

This, it was said, was due primarily to the type of car. The huge gasoline supply tank for the car's big motor burst, saturating the imprisoned passengers. Then the gasoline caught fire.
