# Austrians Reach Besieged Fortress.

### **GERMANS HOLD GROUND**

### Situation in East Prussia Reported Unchanged.

London, Oct. 13.-Information given out in Berlin indicates the Russian siege of Przemysl, the Austrian fortress in Galicia, has been abandoned. Austrian troops are reported to have defeated a Russian division near Lancut and to have routed a division of Cossacks east of Nymao. Vienna advices say Przemysl has been relieved by Austrian columns, who have entered the fortress. The Russians are said to have fled in the direction of the River San, a number being captured while attempting to cross the Rivers Siniava and Lepaysk.

The Russian official statement makes no reference to Przemysl, but says the Austrians in Galicia are operating in small groups in various sections of the country. One Austrian withhold details of fighting in this division was surprised by Russian cavalry, says the statement, and dispersed. In East Prussia the situation is unchanged. Several engagements have taken place on the left bank of the Vistula, but the Germans seem to be holding their positions. 
