#### Dry Gain.

Results from the Virginia election of members of the general assembly show that there will be a heavy majority in the senate and house pledged to the enactment of prohibition legislation effective when the state goes dry by constitutional amendment November 1, 1916. The democratic faction will control the joint democratic caucus by an overwhelming majority.

Democratic leaders in Mississippi elected a full set of state, county and district officers on a ticket headed by Theo. G. Bilbo for governor and Lee M. Russell for lieutenant governor.

Thief River Falls, Minn., Nov. 3.—H. Campbell was elected mayor here yesterday.

### CROOKSTON HOLDS ELECTION

Crookston, Minn., Nov. 3.—H. W. Misner was elected mayor of Crookston yesterday, defeating Larson and Sathre. Misner polled 458 votes, Larson 320 and Sathre 382.

Louis Ellingson was elected clerk. F. E. R. Erickson was elected treasurer, and H. E. Ebbenhausen was elected assessor.

W. R. Lowe, W. L. Ireland, L. D. Foskett, C. P. Booth, William Becker and O. O. Christianson were elected aldermen.

The amendment to the city charter providing for the increase in the tax levy to 14 mills for the general fund, to take the place of the revenue formerly derived from the license money

paid by the saloons, carried by a good majority.

### NORTHWEST NEWS

St. Cloud, Minn., Nov. 3.—A meeting of the Stearns-Benton Counties Medical association will be held here Nov. 18. Dr. Thomas McDevitt of St. Paul is to deliver an address on "Glaucoma."

Rochester, Minn., Nov. 3.—Twenty-two youths have been arrested by the police of Rochester for the destruction of property on Halloween night.

Winona, Minn., Nov. 3.—David Starr Jordan, chancellor of Leland Stanford university, will deliver his peace address in Winona next Friday evening.

Maiden Rock, Wis., Nov. 3.—Miss Ina Brown, 17 years old, living near Eau Claire, is in a serious condition from the effects of drinking chloroform.

Winnipeg, Man., Nov. 3.—Twenty-six thousand parcels, containing gifts for the soldiers of Serbia, have been donated in Winnipeg during the past week, and will be shipped to Serbia soon.

Thief River Falls, Minn., Nov. 3.—R. H. Ross, who came to this city from Grand Rapids last spring to be city editor of the Times, has purchased the paper from Thomas H. Smith and took possession yesterday.

Duluth, Minn., Nov. 3.—More than 1,000 men have been sent to the lumber camps tributary to this point in the past week and more are being sent every day. There will be more than twice as many camps this year, and wages will be about double of those paid last year. The demand for men is heavy and it is expected that before Christmas a scarcity will exist. The exodus of foreigners to enter the war, and the lack of immigration is causing an employment problem.

St. Paul, Minn., Nov. 3.—Attorney General Smith today ruled that state boiler inspectors are not authorized to examine the heating boilers of low pressure in hotels. He holds, however, that they may inspect stationary boilers in locomotive round-houses.

### CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION OF HARDING-WHALEY COMPANY.

Section 1. The name of this corporation shall be Harding-Whaley Company.  
Section 2. The general nature of its business shall be the conducting of moving picture shows, theatres and amusement enterprises, the conducting of hotel and rooming houses, the purchase, sale, leasing and mortgaging of real and personal property, and to transact such business as may be necessary and incident thereto.  
Section 3. The principal place for the transaction of the business of said corporation shall be at the City of Bemidji, Beltrami County, Minnesota.

ARTICLE I.  
Said corporation shall commence on the 8th day of November, 1915, and shall continue for a period of thirty years.

ARTICLE II.  
The names and places of residence of the persons forming said corporation are:  
G. S. Harding, Residing at Bemidji, Minnesota.  
Oliver Whaley, Residing at Bemidji, Minnesota.  
W. L. Brooks, Residing at Bemidji, Minnesota.

ARTICLE IV.  
The government of said corporation and the management of its affairs shall be vested in a board of three directors, who shall be elected from the stockholders of said corporation at its annual meeting, which shall be held in the City of Bemidji, Minnesota, on the second Monday in July of each year, and they shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified. Until the first annual meeting of the stockholders of said corporation, the following named persons shall constitute the Board of Directors of said corporation: G. S. Harding, residing at Bemidji, Minnesota; Oliver Whaley, residing at Bemidji, Minnesota; and W. L. Brooks, residing at Bemidji, Minnesota.

ARTICLE V.  
The officers of this corporation shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, of whom shall be chosen by the Board of Directors from the stockholders of said corporation. The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be held by the same person.  
Until the first annual meeting of said corporation, and until their successors are elected and qualified, G. S. Harding shall be President, W. L. Brooks shall be Vice President, and Oliver Whaley shall be Secretary and Treasurer of said corporation.

ARTICLE VI.  
The capital stock of said corporation shall be Fifty Thousand Dollars, and the same shall be divided into five hundred shares of the par value of one hundred dollars each. Said stock shall be paid in as called for by the Board of Directors of said corporation.

ARTICLE VII.  
The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which said corporation shall at any time be subject, shall not exceed twenty-five thousand dollars.
