BOOKER T. WASHINGTON.

Booker T. Washington, the negro educator and leader, who died yesterday at Tuskegee, Ala., was undoubtedly one of the most remarkable men of his time.

Booker T. Washington was born a slave, at Hale's Ford, Va., in 1857 or 1858. His owner's name was John Burroughs.

After working in the mines and furnaces for some time, he obtained employment at the house of Mrs. Faria Rufner, a lady of New England birth and training.

Flinding shelter in a hole under the sidewalk, he slept there all night, awakening next day to find himself near a dock where pig iron was unloaded from a vessel.

It was in 1881 application was made to Gen. S. C. Armstrong, by citizens of Tuskegee, Ala., for some one to start an institution at that place.

By Herculean efforts he managed to raise enough money during the next five months to pay off the debt. Now, after thirty years of existence, the school's plant with its 2,500 acres of land and its forty or more buildings, is estimated at more than \$1,500,000.


