ARBOR DAY. Governor J. A. A. Burnquist today issued a proclamation setting apart Friday, April 28, to be Arbor and Bird day.

Proclamation. The season of the year has again arrived when every home in Minnesota can be beautified by the planting of trees, shrubbery and flowers.

It is remarkable that a difference in the manifestation of even a little community interest in the promotion of arboriculture makes in the appearance of the grounds of our schools and public buildings and of all our farms and municipalities.

Closely associated with the care and growth of trees and plants is the protection of bird life. The hostility and indifference of mankind to the feathered creatures of the woods should be eliminated and all possible efforts advanced to save from extermination these friends and companions of man.

In order to set apart a certain day for the observing of which, wherever convenient, appropriate ceremonies may be held, I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate and proclaim Friday, April 28, 1916, to be Arbor and Bird Day.

Witness my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota affixed here to this 22nd day of March, 1916. J. J. A. BURNQUIST, Governor.
